District Goals

By June 2019 all students will be at grade level or higher in both math and reading. We achieve these goals by:

- ensuring that all students learn in a community of highly committed, dynamic and passionate individuals;
- improving central office and building systems, organizational structures and services to foster a safe and positive learning environment, and utilize resources most efficiently;
- expanding and increasing community partnerships that meet in and out of school needs of students and families in order to improve student outcomes;

More specifically, Bristol Public Schools will:

- Send home reading support strategies that include practical ideas for supporting reading.
- Provide opportunities for meaningful interactions with fiction and non-fiction texts.
- Provide opportunities for rich mathematical discussions to increase understanding.
- Encourage, model, and prompt for PACK behavior in order to develop responsible citizens.

At Home

West Bristol School families joined staff to develop ideas on how families can support students' success in reading and math.

- Have your child read from various sources such as: directions, recipes, newspapers, etc...
- Develop a routine and set aside time to read.
- Have your child complete their daily reading log.
- Practice math facts.
- Support and encourage PAWS behavior.

West Bristol Students

West Bristol School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas on how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in math and reading. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and at school.

- Math
- Online addition and subtraction games
 - Practice flash cards

- Reading
- Read for 20 minutes a night and fill in reading logs.
 - Choose a variety of books to read independently.
