District Goals

By June 2019 all students will be at grade level or higher in both math and reading. We achieve these goals by:

- ensuring that all students learn in a community of highly committed, dynamic and passionate individuals;
- improving central office and building systems, organizational structures and services to foster a safe and positive learning environment, and utilize resources most efficiently;

Teachers, Families, Students—Together for Success

In our 6th Grade Classroom

The 6th grade team will work with students and their families to support students' success in literacy and mathematics.

Some of our key connections are listed below:

- Teachers provide a means to self-monitor academic progress. Each student has received a Power School user name and password. Students are also given weekly progress reports to gauge their success and identify areas in need of improvement.
- Students are being taught to use their time more effectively by organizing their materials, seeking additional assistance, independent reading, and conferencing with teachers.
- Teachers provide additional opportunities throughout the day and after school to enhance student understanding of subject material.

At Home

West Bristol School families were asked to contribute ideas on how families can support students' success in literacy and mathematics.

- Parents can access Power School parent portal to monitor their child's academic progress.
- Partnerships develop with the school community through contact by email and phone. Contact should be made whenever there are concerns regarding overall progress, homework, or other external influences.
- Become an active participant in each child's school experience by helping to develop an after school routine for organizing and completing assignments.
- Fostering shared experiences that promote life-long learning
