Visual Arts: - Drawing from a Still-Life

Targeted Goals from Stage 1: Desired Results

Content Knowledge: Students will use their observational skills to create an interesting composition from a collection of found objects.

Vocabulary: Still-life, composition, shape, form, positive and negative space

Skills: Drawing from observation, using line to create a basic shape, using shading to create a specific form

Expectation: Students will select a variety of objects found around their home. They will create an interesting arrangement that will be used in a still-life drawing composition. Materials can consist of pencil, colored pencil, or pastel.

 For your composition (arrangement of objects that will be used for your final drawing): Select a variety of objects that are interesting to look at. The selection should be an odd number of objects (this visually works best). Make sure the objects you choose vary in height. Your comfort level will vary depending on your drawing 	Materials: Paper, pencil, eraser, (optional: colored pencils, pastels), Sketchbook for drawing, or separate paper. The key to getting started:		
 Look at the objects as a basic shape. Notice if you can see multiple sides to the object. Notice if the lines that make up the object are straight or curved. (Optional) Add shading to make the drawing look more realistic.
