

## Grade 1 Choice Board: Word Pattern Reading Hunts

Directions: Make one choice on the board each time you read. Read a book of your choice. As you read alone or with a family member, write or call out the words that you find that fit the pattern.

<p>Find words that are a <b>closed, one</b> syllable word.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Make the sign for the short vowel sound that you hear.</li> </ul>	<p>Clap out the syllables when you think you read a word that is <b>more than one syllable</b>.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Do you hear any <b>closed syllables</b> (short vowels sounds)?</li> </ul>	<p>Find words that have an <b>open</b> syllable.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Point to the open vowel.</li> </ul>	<p>Look for words with the <b>ck</b> (<b>cat/kite</b>) rule.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Stop if you hear the /k/ sound at the end of a word or syllable. Is there a short vowel before a “ck”?</li> </ul>	<p>Look for <b>red word</b> you know.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Stop. Can you tap out the word along your arm?</li> </ul>
<p><b>Magic e or Silent e</b> hunt. Look for words with long vowel sounds. Is the magic or silent e nearby?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a_e, e_e, i_e, o_e, u_e</li> </ul>	<p>Find all the words that have a <b>long-e</b> sound.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• e_e</li> <li>• ee</li> <li>• ea</li> </ul>	<p>Find all the words that have a <b>long-a</b> sound.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• a_e</li> <li>• ai</li> <li>• ay</li> </ul>	<p>Look for words with the ending “<b>ed</b>” at the end.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Does “ed” say d, t, or ed?</li> </ul>	<p>Find all the words that have a <b>long-o</b> sound.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Silent e</li> <li>• oe</li> <li>• ow</li> </ul>
<p>Hunt for words with s blends: <b>sl, st, sp, sn, sm, sc, sk, sw</b></p>	<p>Hunt for words with consonant diagraph blends: <b>sh, ch, wh, th</b></p>	<p>Hunt for words with l blends: <b>pl, bl, fl, cl, gl, sl</b></p>	<p>Hunt for words with r blends: <b>cr, fr, gr, pr, tr, dr, br, str</b></p>	<p>Look for the <b>double rule</b>. When /f/ /l/ /s/ or /z/ is heard after a short vowel at the end of a one syllable word, it is spelled with a double <b>ff, ll, ss, or zz</b>.</p>
