(RL.3)</p> <p><b>Acknowledge</b> differences in the points of view of character, by speaking in a different voice for each character. (RL.8)</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Informational</p> <p><b>Identify</b> the main topic of a multi-paragraph text as well as the focus of specific paragraphs within a text. (RI.2)</p> <p><b>Explain</b> how illustrations clarify text. (RI.7)</p> <p><b>Describe</b> how reasons support specific points in a text. (RI.8)</p>

<p><b>Ask</b> and answer questions to help determine or clarify the meaning of words and phrases in a text. (RL.4)</p> <p><b>Uses</b> context and affixes to determine word meaning. (L.4a,b)</p> <p><b>Apply</b> root words and inflectional endings to determine or clarify word meaning. (L.4c)</p> <p><b>Sorts</b> and defines words by category. (L.5a)</p> <p>Distinguish shades of meaning among words. (L.5b)</p> <p><b>Distinguish</b> adjectives differing in intensity. <p><b>Explains</b> major differences between books that tell a story and books that give information. (RL.5)</p> <p><b>Know</b> and use various text features to locate information in a text. (RI.5)</p>	<p><b>Describe</b> the overall structure of a story; how the beginning introduces the story and the ending concludes the action. (RL.5)</p> <p><b>Know</b> and use various text features to find information or key facts in a text. (RI.5)</p> <p><b>Identify</b> the main purpose of a text , including what the author wants to answer, explain or describe. (RI.6)</p>
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**Makes comparisons and connections to what is read.**

<p><b>Compare</b> and contrast the adventures and experience of characters in a text. (RL.9)</p> <p><b>Describe</b> the connection between two individual, event, ideas or pieces of information. (RI.3)</p> <p><b>Distinguish</b> between information provided by pictures or other illustrations and information provided by words. (RL.6)</p> <p><b>Identify</b> basic similarities in and differences between two texts on the same topic. (RI.9)</p>	<p><b>Compare</b> two or more versions of the same story by different authors or from different cultures. (RL.9)</p> <p><b>Describe</b> the connection between a series of historical events, scientific ideas or concepts, or steps in technical procedures. (RI.3)</p> <p><b>Compare</b> and contrast the most important points and key details presented in two texts on the same topic. (RI.9)</p>
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
