## **Making Test Scores Actionable**

Today's students take many different types of assessments and receive many different scores. These scores provide important measures of student proficiency in content areas, but they are often static. The data can't be used to inform instruction or to help educators and parents to select appropriate reading materials based on each child's ability.

The Lexile Framework® for Reading changes that. When an assessment is linked to the Lexile Framework, students' test scores immediately become actionable. Lexiles® are the most widely adopted reading measure in use today, measuring both reader ability and text difficulty on the same scale. Lexiles are a powerful tool for linking assessment with instruction across the curriculum, at home and in the library, by taking the guesswork out of selecting materials that can help to improve student reading ability.

## **Matching Readers and Text**

Consider this: a father takes his son to the store to buy shoes. The salesperson asks them, "What kind of shoes do you need?" The father replies, "He needs basketball shoes." As the salesperson leads them to the basketball shoes, he asks, "How old is your son?" The father answers, "He is 12." And so the salesperson points to five pairs of shoes on the wall and says, "There are our age-12 basketball shoes."

Not likely, right? We do not buy shoes by age, we buy them by size. However, for years we have matched students to books and other learning materials based on age or grade level. If a student likes science fiction books and is nine years old or in fourth grade, he is given "fourth-grade science fiction" to read. But what if that fourth grader's reading ability is far higher than the "average" student his age, or he is not quite reading on a fourth-grade level? Like the boy's age-12 basketball shoes, the text simply does not fit the student.

When shoe shopping, the scale used to measure the boy's foot for his sneakers tells you his shoe size, not his age. Similarly, the Lexile Framework determines a student's reading ability, not his grade level. With Lexiles, assessment results are used to ensure a "good fit" because the measure is used to select reading material that meets and challenges each student's ability.

## **Differentiating Instruction Across the Curriculum**

Lexiles provide more than a way to pick the right book for a student to read. They are a powerful tool for targeting instruction and improving achievement across grade levels and content areas. Using Lexiles, educators connect students with instructional resources that match their reading abilities. And the number of fiction and nonfiction books, textbooks, periodicals

Performance levels are levels of student mastery of the content areas. The levels are "Novice," "Partial Mastery," "Mastery," "Above Mastery," and "Distinguished" (see reverse side). The performance level indicates your student can consistently perform what is described for that level and the levels below. Your student may also be capable of performing some of the competencies described at higher levels, but not with the consistency to have attained those levels of performance.

#### Definitions

**Incomplete:** If a student received an "Incomplete" in the student's scale score box, he/she did not complete the required number of test items to receive a score.

**Lexile Measure:** The Lexile measure is a developmental scale and links the WESTEST 2 Reading/Language Arts score to the reading ability.

## Lexile Analyzer: First Use

Before you measure it, you must prepare your file correctly. The Lexile Analyzer measures the readability of conventional prose only. You want to measure only the complete sentences of the main part of your text. So remove all non-prose content from your file before you measure it. Non-prose content typically includes:

- Chapter and section titles
- Headings and sub-headings
  - Incomplete sentences
- Page headers, footers, and numbers
  - Frontmatter (tables of contents)
- Backmatter (glossaries, indexes, bibliographies)
  - Captions that are incomplete sentences
- Bulleted/numbered lists in which the list items are incomplete sentences
  - The leading name and colon used in interviews
    - Footnotes and endnotes
    - Poetry/song extracts
      - URLs
    - Tables and graphs
      - Abbreviations
  - Phonetic pronunciation guides

### **Safety and the Law**

The safety of all customers and employees is the responsibility of every foodservice establishment. Customers have a legal right to expect safe food served in a safe environment on safe premises. Premises encompass all the property around the restaurant. Employees also have a legal right to work in a safe environment that is free of hazards. Restaurants that fail to provide safety for their customers or employees can be sued, and can lose their good reputation as well as large amounts of money. Foodservice operators have become more aware of their responsibility—and possible liability—for their customers and employees. Liability means the legal responsibility that one person has to another. These responsibilities, or liabilities, are serious because they are enforceable by law in court.

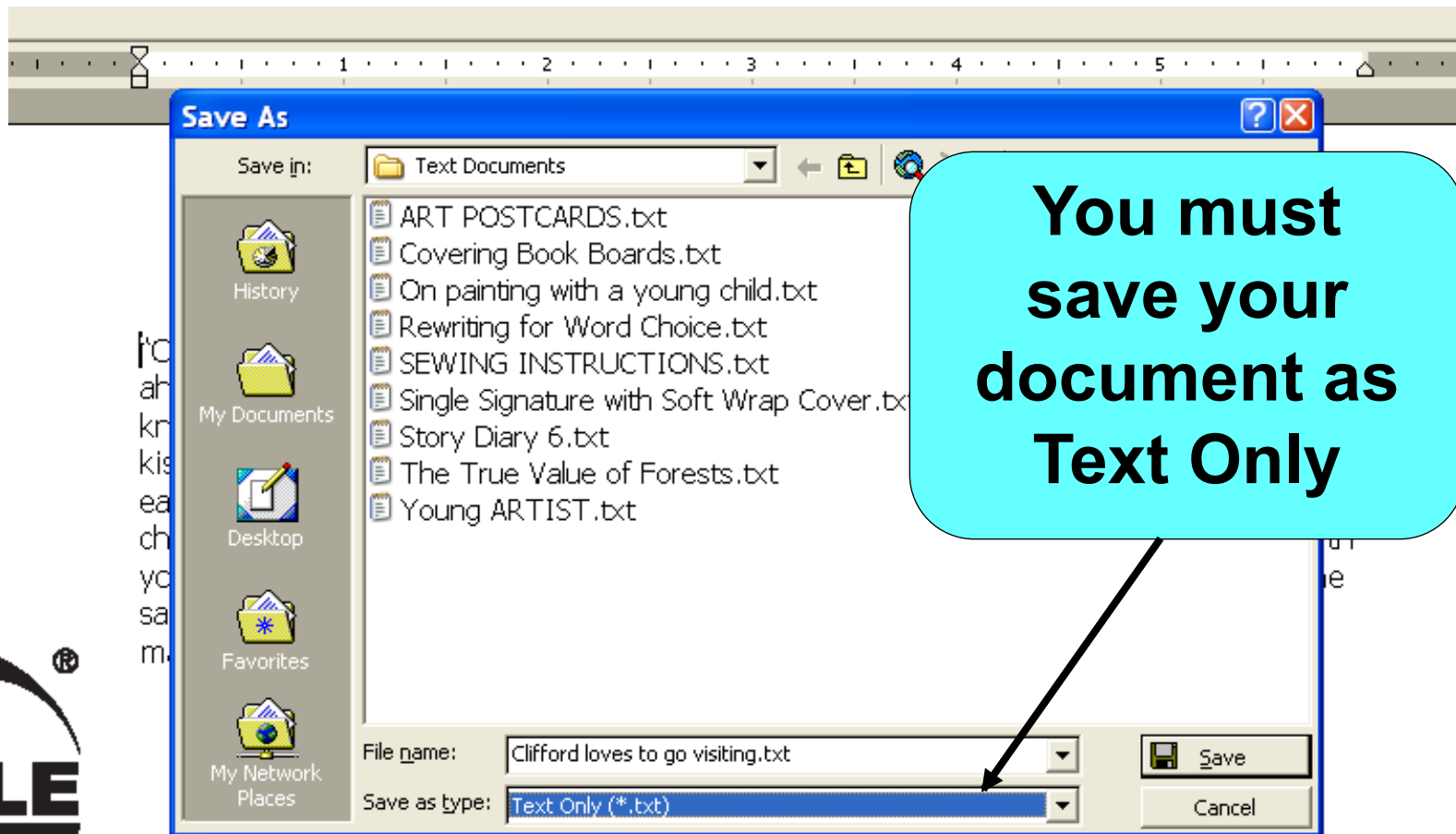
#### **Workers' compensation**

You may have heard the term workers' compensation, which is a state-administered program designed to help employees who are injured in accidents that occurred at work, or who become sick because of job-related reasons. Workers' compensation provides payments for lost work time, payments for medical treatment, and payments for rehabilitation and retraining for the injured employee.

### **Fat and Cholesterol**

Many people wish to reduce the amount of fat in their diets, although a certain amount of fat is necessary for proper nutrition. Fat usually refers to both fats and oils. There are some basic differences between fats and oils. Fats are solid at room temperature and oils are liquid at room temperature; fats usually come from animals, while oils come from plants. Fat is an essential nutrient that supplies chemicals called essential fatty acids that are needed for health skin, health cells, and other bodily functions. Fat also carries vitamins A, D, E, and K through the body. In addition, the body stores fat to provide a reserve supply of energy.

### Adolescent Literacy in the 21st Century

The present understanding of literacy growth indicates that students must continue to learn many new things, and acquire additional skills, in order to maintain literacy proficiency as they move from elementary to middle and high school. We have taken considerable measures to ensure that every child masters the basics of reading by the end of third grade. However, the demands for adolescent literacy have not been as aggressive. It was not until 2003 in an initiative by the Carnegie Corporation that an effort was made to begin to improve the literacy of students in grades four through twelve. Although research on adolescent literacy is not as extensive as early reading, there is enough known about the nature, problems and interventions for struggling readers that schools and classroom teachers can make a difference now.

There are approximately eight million struggling readers in grades 4-12 (NCES, 2003). These struggling readers vary in the challenges they face in every classroom. Most adolescents can read when they enter middle and high school, but they cannot comprehend the text, or what they read. Only about ten percent of adolescents cannot decode words (Biancarosa and Snow, 2006). Therefore, it is extremely important that content area teachers, adopt instructional practices and strategies that can be used within their existing curricula to improve the literacy levels of the struggling readers. Better literacy skills improve student achievement in math, science and social studies, as well as English.
