New grading scale

The new report cards will use the same four-point scale across all elementary grades. The Academic Performance Scale describes the student's skill and knowledge level based on their classroom performance. A student earning a 3 at the end of the school year is making the expected progress on grade level standards.

Work Habits & Citizenship

In addition to the academic reporting, parents will find an important section at the end of the report card that provides them with information about how their student approaches school.

The semester report card in January will be the first time your student will receive this new performance report. More detailed information about the new report cards will be shared through school and classroom newsletters.



Schools introduce new elementary report cards

Newberg Public Schools are introducing a new elementary report card to help families better understand what is being studied, what students are expected to know and how students are performing.

- Each grade level has its own unique report card based on current state content standards.
- Most subjects that previously had a single mark or grade, now feature more information about what students are expected to know and do.
- Progress is reported on subject area details aligned with the required content standards.
- Classroom performance for the semester reflects progress toward expectations and standards for the entire school year.
