Targeted Goals from Stage 1: Desired Results: Readers monitor their comprehension and use strategies when meaning breaks down. Readers use text structures and features to understand, question and interpret text. Critical readers reflect on and question the text, consider different perspectives to examine the author's message. Readers think about the impact a person of importance has had on our lives today.

Content Knowledge: Writers write biographies about both important and famous people, non-fiction writing includes a version of the facts, writers of biography have an opinion and perspective on the person they are writing about, biographies include an author's collection of information about a person's life

Vocabulary: Opinion, evidence, reason, explanation, racism, segregation, equality, prejudice

Skills: Supporting your claim with evidence, comparing and contrasting- important vs. famous
