Targeted Goals from Stage 1: Sketchbook construction and design

Expectation: Students will construct a sketchbook and design a cover design that incorporates their name that is creative, visually interesting and neatly rendered.

Description of Task (s):	Resources and Materials:	Daily Checks (Return to Google Classroom or snapshots from a cell phone)
Day 1: Sketchbook construction. Please combine 30 or more pieces of paper together and staple along the side in three places (top, bottom and middle).	30 pieces of paper. Suggested size and type: 8'x'10", white computer or printer paper Stapler	Sketchbook constructed
Day 2: Sketchbook cover design thumbnails. On the first inside page (not the cover), draw a few (3 or more) small quick drawings or designs that you will later consider for your cover. Each should include your first name.	Pencil and eraser	3 or more thumbnail sketches
Day 3: Sketchbook cover design rough sketch. Choose one of your thumbnail drawings for your final cover drawing or design. Sketch it lightly to actual size, to fit onto your sketchbook cover.	Pencil and eraser	Rough sketch of design cover (Actual size)
Day 4: Sketchbook cover final drawing.	Pencil and eraser. Sharpie	Final drawing
