NEW STUDENT CHECKLIST HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRY

- A student from out of country <u>must</u> have a current and complete physical including all required immunizations. Physical should be on State of Connecticut blue form.
- If a student is entering from out of country you <u>must</u> check to see if country is on the high risk list for Tuberculosis (TB).
- Any student from a high risk country will need a TB test and results documented prior to school entry.
- No student may enter with a positive result unless they have documentation from a physician that they are cleared to attend school and are not contagious.
- A student coming from another state wants to enter Pre-K, K, 7th or 11th grade they need;
 - 1. A current physical using our blue physical form <u>or</u> a form from a physician that includes the same information that is on our blue form.
 - 2. Must have required immunizations for up to and including requirements for entry into the specific grade
- A student coming from another state and entering any grade other than the above grades will need;
 - 1. A physical using our blue physical form <u>or</u> a form from a physician that includes the same information that is on our blue form. Physical does not need to be current.
 - 2. Must have required immunizations for up to and including requirements for entry into the specific grade
- A student coming from another school <u>within</u> Connecticut wishing to enter Pre-K, K, 7th or 11th grade they need;
 - 1. A current physical using the State of Connecticut blue physical form.
 - 2. Must have required immunizations for up to and including requirement for entry into the specific grade
- A student coming from another school within Connecticut and entering any grade other than the above grades will need;
 - 1. A physical on the State of Connecticut blue physical form. The physical does not need to be current.
 - 2. Must have required immunizations for up to and including requirement for entry into the specific grade

(Children entering after age 3 but before age 5)

4 doses

Polio:

3 doses

1 dose on or after the 1st birthday 3 doses, last one on or after 24

1 dose on or after the 1st birthday or

verification of disease

Hib:

1 dose on or after the 1st birthday

Pneumococcal

1 dose on or after the 1st birthday

Influenza: 1 dose administered each year between August 1-December 31st

2 doses given six months apart, 1st dose on or after 1st birthday

KINDERGARTEN

DTaP:

At least 4 doses. The last dose must be given on or after 4th birthday

Polio: MMR: At least 3 doses. The last dose must be given on or after 4th birthday 2 doses separated by at least 28 days, 15t dose on or after the 1st

birthday.

Hep B:

3 doses, last dose on or after 24 weeks of age

Varicella:

2 doses separated by at least 3 months-1st dose on or after the 1st

birthday; or verification of disease

Hib:

1 dose on or after 1st birthday for children less than 5 years old

GRADES 1-6

DTaP /Td/Tdap: At least 4 doses. The last dose must be given on or after 4th birthday.

Students who start the series at age 7 or older only need a total of 3

Polio: MMR: At least 3 doses. The last dose must be given on or after 4th birthday

2 doses separated by at least 28 days, 1st dose on or after the 1st

Hep B:

3 doses, last dose on or after 24 weeks of age

Varicella:

1 dose on or after the 1st birthday; or verification of disease

GRADE 7

Tdap/Td

1 dose for students who have completed their primary DTaP series.

Students who start the series at age 7 or older only need a total of 3 doses of tetanus-diphtheria containing vaccine, one of which must be

Tdap

Polio: MMR: At least 3 doses. The last dose must be given on or after 4th birthday 2 doses separated by at least 28 days, 1st dose on or after the 1st

birthday

Meningococcal 1 dose

Hep B:

3 doses, last dose on or after 24 weeks of age

Varicella:

2 doses separated by at least 3 months-1st dose on or after the 1st

birthday; or verification of disease

GRADE 8-12

Td/Tdap: At least 3 doses. The last dose must be given on or after 4th birthday

Students who start the series at age 7 or older only need a total of 3

doses one of which should be Tdap.

Polio: MMR: At least 3 doses. The last dose must be given on or after 4th birthday 2 doses separated by at least 28 days, 1st dose on or after the 1st

birthday

Hep B:

3 doses, last dose on or after 24 weeks of age

Varicella:

For students <13 years of age, 1 dose given on or after the 1st birthday; for unvaccinated students 13 years of age or older, 2 doses given at

least 4 weeks apart; or verification of disease

Important Reminders:

DTaP vaccine is not given on or after 7th birthday

DTaP may be given for all doses in the primary series

 Tdap can be given in lieu of Td vaccine for children 7 years and older unless contraindicated. Tdap is only licensed for one dose.

Hib is not given or required for children 5 years of age or older

 Pneumococcal is not required for children 5 years of age or older. Pneumococcal is required for all Pre-K students born on or after 1/1/2007. The vaccine will be required for any K student less than 5 years of age and born on or after 1/1/2007 in the 2012-13 school year.

 Hepatitis A is required for all Pre-K students born on or after 1/1/2007. The vaccine will be required for all Kindergarten students born on or after 1/1/2007 in the 2012-13 school year.

Hep B requirement for school year 2011-2012 applies to all students in grades K-12
 Spacing intervals for a valid Hep B series are at least 4 weeks between dose #1 and dose #2; 8 weeks between dose #2 and dose #3; at least 16 weeks between dose #1 and dose #3; dose #3 should not be given before 24 weeks of age.

Second MMR for school year 2011-2012 applies to all students in grades K-12

Laboratory confirmation of immunity is only acceptable for Hepatitis B, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Hepatitis A, and Varicella

VERIFICATION OF VARICELLA DISEASE: Confirmation in writing by a MD, PA, or APRN that the child has a
previous history of disease, based on family or medical history

New Entrant Definition:

*New entrants are any students who are new to the school district, including preschoolers and all students coming in from Connecticut private, parochial and charter schools located in the same or another community. All students entering kindergarten, including those moving from any public or private pre-school program, even in the same school district, are considered new entrants. The one exception is students returning from private approved special education placements – they are not considered new entrants.
