Historic Sites Network

- History Where It Happened
- Defined in statutes in M.S. 138.662
- State's most significant historic sites
- Important part of tourism economy -- many out of state visitors
- Educational and affordable destination for families and school groups



Performance Measures

Number of People Served --

- Over 600,000 Visitors to Historic Sites
- Nearly 250,000 Visitors to History Center
- Nearly 225,000 schoolchildren on organized programs to historic sites and museums





Performance Measures


- Nearly two million visitors on the Society's website www.mnhs.org
- Northern Lights, MN history curriculum is used by 60,300 sixth graders, 48% of sixth grade students in MN
- 28,000 participants in History Day (many *national* award winners from Minnesota)
- 20,000 Members
- Volunteers make this all happen!
 - Over 1,500 volunteers contributing 42,000 hours = approx. 20 FTE





Minnesota Historical Society Budget

- State general fund dollars are the base of support, and are supplemented by non-state funding: earned revenue, gifts, memberships, grants
- Additional funding is at least \$14 million each year. This enhances the state's history program at no cost to the state.





Budget

State General Fund Operating Budget:


- \$22,659,000 (FY2010)
- \$22,513,000 (FY2011)

Governor's Recommendation:

- \$21,575,000 (FY2012)
- \$21,459,000 (FY2013)

\$4.27 per Minnesotan per year in general fund dollars to preserve our history


NOTE: The above figures do not include Legacy funds, which were "one time" in appropriation language.





MHS General Fund Budget


- 28% of the Society's General Fund Budget goes to building and debt service.
- MHS works with the Department of Administration/Plant Management Division for care of the History Center. Dollars are "pass through" to the Department of Administration.
- Building and Debt Service totals \$5,954,000.
- Balance is "program budget" or what we have to work with to deliver history to Minnesotans.

How Money is Spent Within Programs


Staffing – Salary and Benefits

- Staffing represents a large proportion of the Society's overall budget
- Staff = direct public service at historic sites, History Center
- 338.3 Full Time Equivalents(FTE) FY12

History Center Building Operations and Debt Service


Other Operations
