- don't just draw a floating head



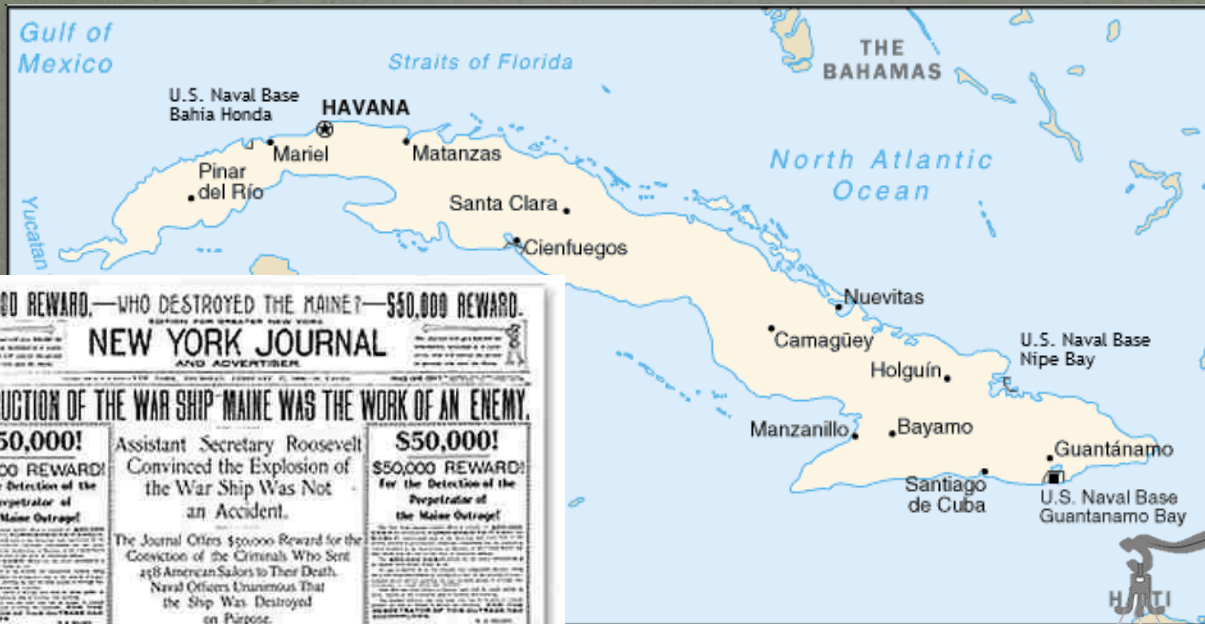

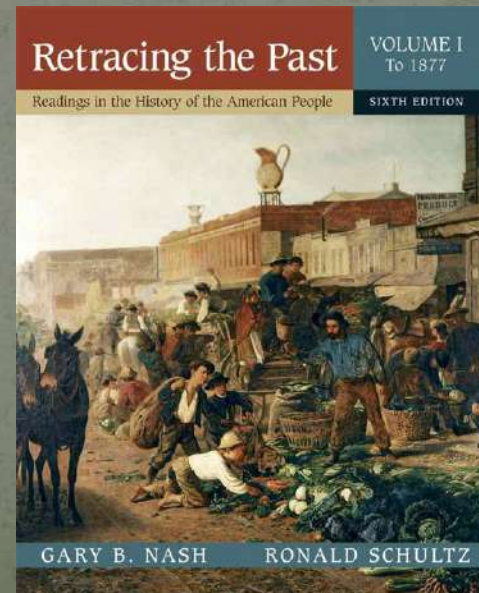
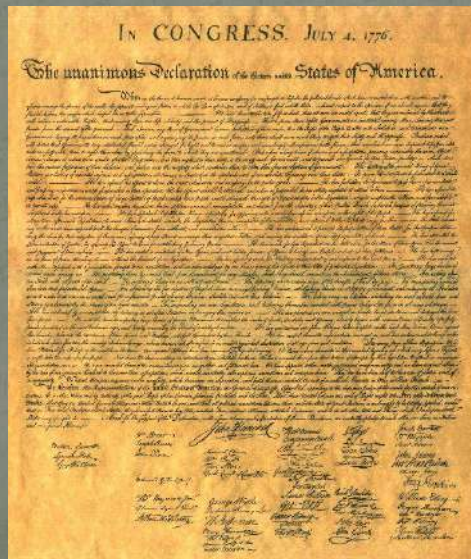
How do we learn about history?

A. Primary sources

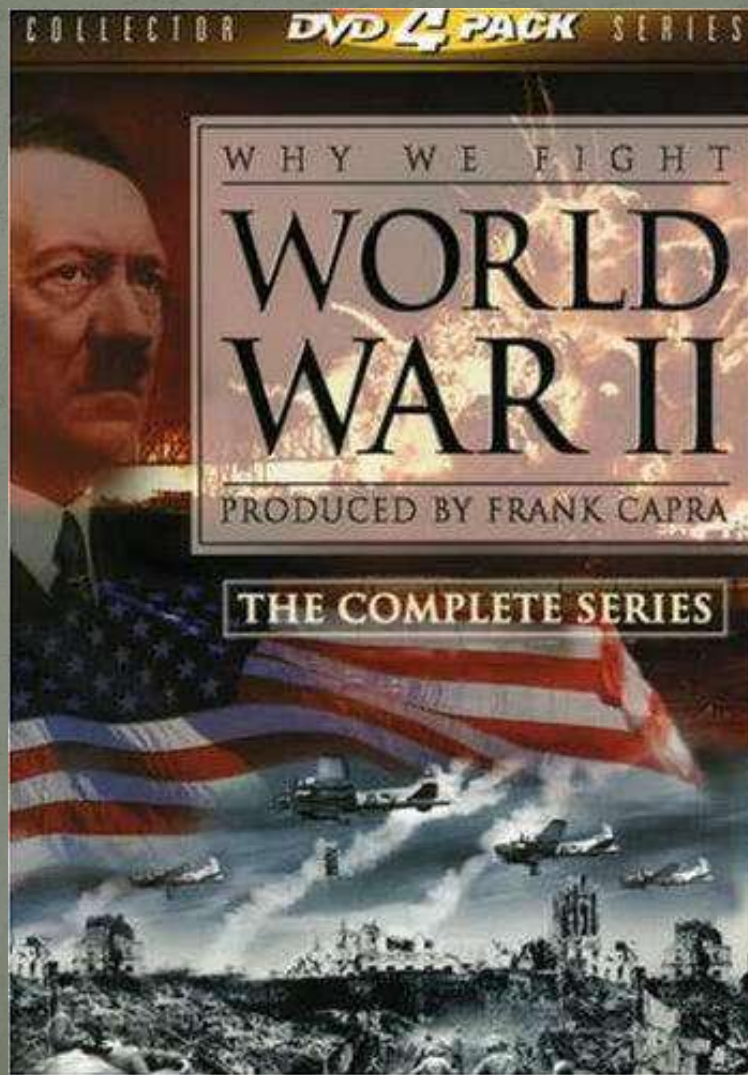
1. Created at the time of the event

To Capt. S^r Thompson - of the Schooner *Swif*

S^r,

With this letter comes a Negro (Tom) which by the favour of your brother, or any of the friends you may go to, for whichever he will fetch, & bring me in return for him

One Pitt of said Negroes
One Dillo of said Tom
One Barrel of Rymes - of good R. Heart
One Box of 50 Mercurials - each 2 about 10 lbs
Two small 2^d Amused - each about 5 lbs each
and the residue, much or little, in good old R. Heart

That this fellow is both a Rogue & a Swarmer (he has once by no means remarkable for the former, and never practised the latter of late) what art you to say - But that he is once in health, strong, and good at his Trade, he whose services you had call to mind to his particular Mr. Thawes and his wife, who have both put him under them as Governor of the party; which gives me cause to hope he may, with your good care and management, I hope, be a little more useful than he is at present.

I shall very cheerfully allow you the customary commissions on this affair, and must beg the favour of you (that he should attempt to escape) to keep him handcuff'd till you get to sea - or in the Bay - after which I doubt not but you may make him most useful to you.

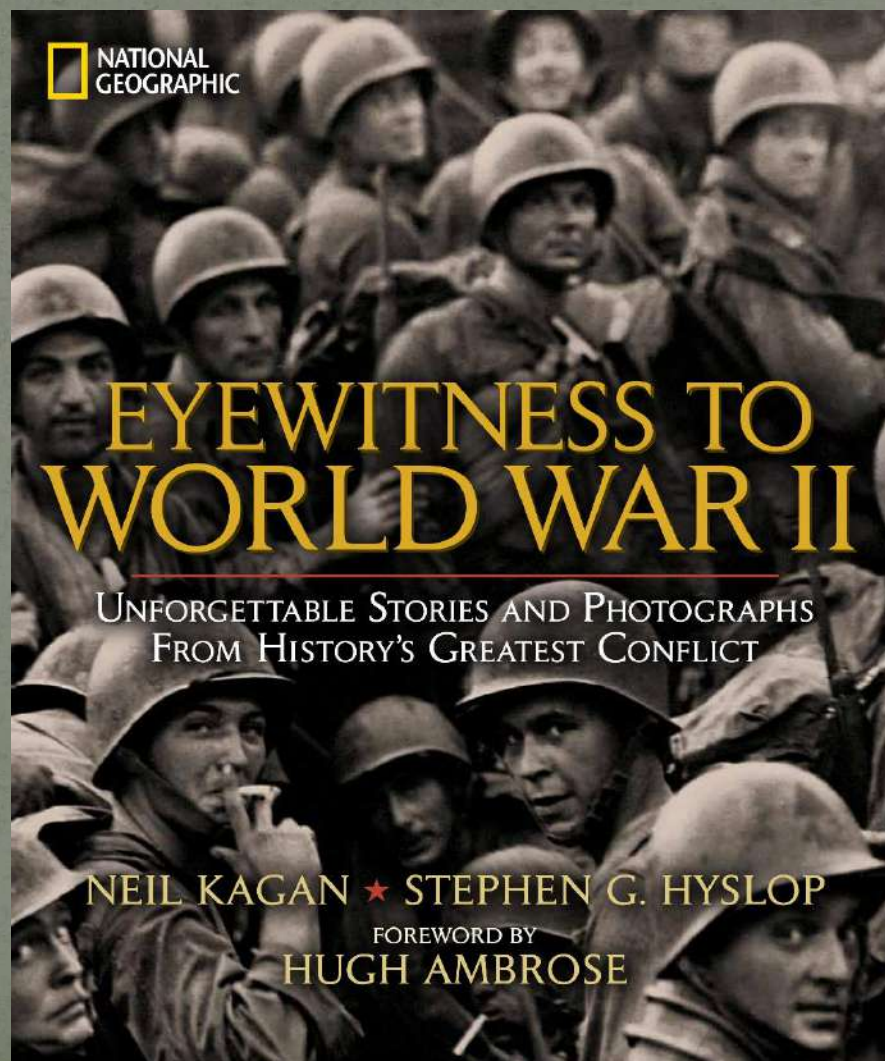
