Entering The Class Procedure

Warm-ups: Each day Mr. Suh will have a warm-up on the board. You are to do these warm-ups independently in your composition notebook without talking or getting up from your seat. Raise your hand if you need assistance. Please do not walk up to the teacher's desk without permission.
