Spring is a busy time of year at HJMS. All students have completed the course selection process for the 2019-20 school year. Counselors met with students during connections periods in the Spring months to verify course and credits as they plan for next year.

On May 9th, members of the Simsbury Chamber of Commerce in addition to parent volunteers met as "mentors" for the 12th annual "Lunch N Learn" program at Henry James. The purpose of the program is to introduce the students to various professionals in their community who are willing to share their life stories while enjoying lunch with small groups of students. Mentors aim to stimulate thinking about a student's own career choice and what steps they can start to take. Key life skills such as making strong eye contact, firm handshakes, and engaging in meaningful conversations were reinforced by Principal Scott Baker. "It's become a great tradition and we can't thank the chamber and parentvolunteers enough for taking the time to work with our students," says School Counselor, Chris Hall.



7th Grade students also had an Introductory Mindfulness Lesson to teach different relaxation strategies to learn to deal with stress & anxiety. Counselors offered Mindful Minutes before school on Wednesday mornings to support all student and faculty ongoing education and practice.

NEWS FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE



Medications - Before any medication, prescribed or over-the-counter (OTC), may be taken by a student, a Simsbury Schools Authorization Form must be on file in the school health office. No prescribed or OTC drug (Tylenol, ibuprofen, aspirin) or topical cream

(hydrocortisone, calamine) will be administered by the nurse or self-administered until this form is on file. This is in compliance with Connecticut statutes and Simsbury Board of Education policy.

At the end of the school year, medications will be sent home with the student with the exception of controlled substances which must be pick up by a parent or guardian by the last day of school, or they will be discarded.



Illnesses and Absences - If your child will be out of school for any reason, you must notify the school **each day** he/she is out. If your child will be finishing the year early, please notify the school with a written note.

HJ MUSIC CONCERTS








JAMES AND THE GIANT PEACH MUSICAL
