Mark T. Sheehan High School Honors and Awards

Honor Roll

There are two levels of honor roll at the high school. To achieve high honors, a student must earn a marking period GPA of 3.6 or higher, and to achieve honors, a MP GPA of 3.2 or higher. Students who have an incomplete, D's, and/or F are not eligible for honor roll.

National Honor Society

The Mark T. Sheehan Edward J. Kosinski Chapter of the National Honor Society (NHS) is open to students who meet the required standards of scholarship, character, leadership, and service. Students are selected for membership by the Faculty Council, which bestows this honor upon qualified students on behalf of the Sheehan faculty. Students who have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.5 through the end of their sophomore or junior year are academically eligible for membership. (The Induction Ceremony takes place in the fall.)

Tri-M Honor Society

The Tri-M Honor Society recognizes students for their musical abilities, academic excellence, school involvement, and community service. Membership is open to students in grades 10 through 12 who meet the required standards of scholarship, character, leadership, and service. Specifically, students must participate in a school music ensemble, earn a B+ or better in music courses, maintain a 3.2 overall GPA with no failures. (The Induction Ceremony takes place in the spring.)

Varsity Scholar

Nomination as a varsity scholar is based on a cumulative GPA of 3.9 or higher based on completed coursework through the end of the first semester of senior year. Additional scholars will be acknowledged at graduation if they meet the cumulative GPA requirement at the end of eight semesters.

Valedictorian and Salutatorian

Designation as valedictorian and salutatorian is based on class rank. The ranking of students is the process of determining the relative academic standing of students within a class. For members of the Class of 2018, final class rank is based on the cumulative GPA of eight semesters. Beginning with the Class of 2019 and subsequent classes, final class rank will be based on the cumulative GPA of six semesters (calculated at the conclusion of junior year).

Spotlight on Students

This awards is designed to honor the student who adds to the positive climate in the classroom—the student who attends class regularly and on time, contributes, is caring and supportive—not necessarily the student with the highest grade average. Each month, one of the departments selects a student for this distinction.

CAS Arts Award (Connecticut Association of Schools)

Awarded to two seniors who excel in the performing and/or visual arts programs.

CIAC Scholar Athlete Award (Connecticut Interscholastic Athletic Conference)

Awarded to a senior male and female student-athlete. In order to qualify for this honor, a student must participate in athletics at the varsity level, demonstrate academic excellence, and more importantly, serve as a role model to others.

SCC Scholar Leader Award (Southern Connecticut Conference)

Awarded to two seniors. In order to qualify for this honor, a student must demonstrate academic excellence, be considered a leader in the school community, and more importantly, serve as a role model to others.

CABE Leadership Award (Connecticut Association of Boards of Education)

Awarded to a senior male and female student. This award recognizes achievement and leadership qualities, particularly with respect to school and community activities.

SCASA Award (South Central Area Superintendents' Association)

Awarded to a senior male and female student. This award is presented to students who embody the mission of their school and are deeply committed to community and humanitarian service.

Rotary Citizen of the Year

This award is presented to two juniors (one male, one female) who are deeply committed to community and humanitarian service and demonstrates scholarship and good character.

Governor's Scholar Award

The Governor's Scholars Program recognizes academically talented high school students in schools throughout the state. At Sheehan, the number one ranked member of the junior class is invited to apply for this recognition.
