FCCLA (Family Career and Community Leaders of America) recently awarded a check for \$500.00 to Dairy Queen as a contribution to the Sally Trammell & Josie Juanes Memorial Scholarship. It was possible through the Fort Morgan Chapter's fundraising efforts including chocolate bar sales, hosting a Craft Bazaar, and a car wash.

This scholarship is in memory of two FMHS Graduates, Sally Trammell and Josie Juanes, who were tragically killed in a car accident in the summer of 2014. Sally was an assistant manager at Dairy Queen and a past member of FCCLA. Josie was also a member of FCCLA and had been involved in the Family and Consumer Sciences Fashion Design and Merchandising program. The non-renewable scholarships are between \$500-\$1,000 and are awarded to use at any college or technical program to students who show academic promise (2.5 GPA) and have financial need.

FCCLA is a student led organization operating at the local, state, and national level. The Fort Morgan chapter currently has 41 members. It focuses each year not only on fundraising, but also community service and participation at Fall, Winter, and State Conferences. #### Tax Help Colorado By Rebecca Schmidt

TAXES! This is considered a bad word by most people. People see the need for taxes, but they either feel they pay too much or they hate having to file their tax returns. They hate April 15 as it is the deadline to file their taxes. The community of Fort Morgan can let go of this hate for two reasons. One is the tax deadline this year has been extended to Tuesday, April 18 (April 15 is a Saturday and Easter weekend). The other reason is they have a Tax Help Colorado Site. This site has been offered for several years at Morgan Community College. The best part is the service can be used by individuals who make less than \$54,000 and it is FREE!!

This year Fort Morgan High School has students interested in pursuing a career in accounting who volunteered their time as well. After taking the first-year accounting course as juniors, they signed-up for Accounting II to increase their knowledge and make them more prepared for college. They spent the first semester learning all about taxes. They learned about filing status, dependents, recording W-2s, interest and retirement income, social security benefits, self-employment, and health savings accounts just to name a few items. The students have learned how to record all this information into an IRS program called Tax Slayer. This program takes the information and uses it to calculate federal and state returns. It also allows the tax site to e-file the returns for you.

At the end of the Semester, the students were required to take 4 IRS certifications (Volunteer Standards of Conduct, Intake/Interview and Quality Review, Advanced, and Health Savings Accounts (HSA) Exams) as part of the VITA/TCE program. Each student had to pass these exams with at least an 80% to volunteer at the tax site.

The tax site was open January 27 through March 7. Help was available Fridays from 9-1 and Tuesdays from 4-7. Kinsey Brashears, Megan Prevost, and Mikayla Prevost were each required to volunteer at least 15 hours at the site as part of their Accounting II class. Two students, Miguel Hernandez and Darli Ramirez, also volunteered time to interpret for those customers speaking only Spanish. These five students accumulated over 95 volunteer hours to help members of the community get their taxes done.

# **Largest Broncos Staff Changes**

The Denver Broncos have overhauled the coaching staff after the Super Bowl 50 Champions sunk to a disappointing 9-7 season. The former Head Coach, Gary Kubiak, retired due to health concerns and several people were let go as well. The stellar Wade Phillips, our former defensive coordinator, headed to Los Angeles. Joe DeCamillis, the special teams coordinator, moved to coach in Jacksonville. As the last major coaching piece, Offensive Coordinator Rick Dennison was fired after the Broncos had a lackluster offensive performance during the season. This left the team with gaping holes at the most critical team positions. Here is a look at the new coaches in those key positions as found on the January and February 7 Mile High Report

Head Coach Vance Joseph: The former Miami Dolphins Defensive Coordinator, Vance Joseph used to be a quarterback at CU. He was hired for his leadership skills and wanting to fit the system to the players, not the players to the system. He had previously impressed John Elway, the Broncos general manager, when he was last interviewed for a team position. This head coaching change should help get the Broncos back on a winning track.

Offensive Coordinator Mike McCoy: Mike McCoy returned to the Broncos after a brief time as the Head Coach of the San Diego Chargers. He has helped coach the likes of Peyton Manning and Philip Rivers, two excellent quarterbacks in their own regards. He should be able to revamp the Bronco's offense back to its former glory.

**Defensive Coordinator Joe Woods:** Joe Woods use to hold the position of Defensive Backs Coach, and was promoted to Defensive Coordinator after furthering the dominance of the "No Fly Zone." He helped coach Aqib Talib and Chris Harris Jr. into the league's most elite cornerbacks, as well as pushing Darian Stewart into a Pro Bowl worthy season. His stated purpose is to "tweak" the defense in order to improve the run game, but he wants to continue the utter dominance of the Bronco's exceptional defense.

Special Teams Coordinator Brock Olivo: After making the move from Kansas City, Brock Olivo, the former Special Teams assistant, comes with a clear mission to improve the Bronco's mediocre special teams. He said that his goal was to, "make sure the players understand the system." He also learned from the best in Dave Toub, the special teams genius of the Kansas City Chiefs. Under Olivo's guidance the special teams unit will be able to go from decent to great, as he has learned under the best.

I expect the Broncos to have immediate improvement,. However, I would also think that next season should start off pretty slow. That could be attributed to working out the kinks because of these many major changes, and even more minor ones. As long as the Broncos are able to improve the offensive and defensive line, look for the team to return to being a Super-Bowl contender.
