

# **Lesson Plan: How Setting Contributes to Character and/or Plot Development**

## **Objective:**

Students will understand how the setting influences character development and plot progression.

#### **Standards:**

- CCSS.ELA-LITERACY.RL.6.3: Describe how a particular story's or drama's plot unfolds in a series of episodes as well as how the characters respond or change as the plot moves toward a resolution.
- CCSS.ELA-LITERACY.RL.6.5: Analyze how a particular sentence, chapter, scene, or stanza fits into the overall structure of a text and contributes to the development of the theme, setting, or plot.

#### **Materials:**

- Short story or excerpt from a novel
- Access to online discussion board (or physical journals)
- Video explaining the impact of setting on characters and plot
- Worksheets for analysis

#### **Pre-Class Activity (Flipped Part):**

- **1. Watch a Video:** Students watch a video explaining how setting impacts character development and plot.
- **2. Read the Text:** Assign students a short story or an excerpt from a novel where setting plays a crucial role.
- **3. Online Discussion:** Students post their initial thoughts on how the setting influenced the characters and plot on an online discussion board.

### **In-Class Activity:**

- **1. Group Discussion:** In small groups, students discuss their insights from the preclass activity. Each group shares their observations with the class.
- **2. Worksheet Analysis:** Students complete a worksheet analyzing specific examples of how the setting influences the characters and plot in the assigned text.

**3. Creative Activity:** Students create a short scene or story where the setting dramatically changes the character's actions or the plot.

## **Post-Class Activity:**

- 1. **Reflection:** Students write a brief reflection on how their understanding of setting and its impact on character and plot has deepened.
- **2. Extension Activity:** Encourage students to find another story or excerpt where the setting is crucial and share it with the class, explaining its impact.

#### **Homework:**

- 1. **Journal Entry:** Students write a journal entry discussing a setting from a favorite book or movie and how it influences the characters and plot.
- 2. Story Rewrite: Choose a scene from the assigned reading and rewrite it, changing the setting. Discuss how the new setting changes the characters' actions and the plot's direction.
- **3. Reading Assignment:** Find a story or chapter where the setting significantly influences the characters or plot, and prepare a brief presentation for the class.

#### **Assessment:**

- Participation in discussions and activities
- Completed worksheets
- Creative scene or story
- Reflection writing
