Next year's Jr's and Sr's (current 10th & 11th grade students), Lyon College will be hosting their 10th annual Outdoor & ACT Prep Camp, May 31st-June 3rd, 2020. Students will receive specialized ACT instruction and get a taste of the Lyon Education and Adventure Program. Students will have 12 hours total of morning and afternoon ACT sessions combined with a rotation of outdoor activities to strengthen students' character and team-building skills, along with their ACT performance. To register, students need to complete the online form at <http://www.lyon.edu/ACTcamp>. The cost is \$350 if you register by May 1st.

Scholarships:

All UAFS scholarships require students to be college level on their ACT. College level requires students to have obtained at least a 19 in all subsections along with their composite score.

UAFS does not superscore ACT exams.

SENIOR EVENTS AND INFORMATION:

Seniors, if your ACT score improved on this last ACT you will need to let the office know what colleges to send your updated scores to.

Seniors don't forget to be working on your resume and asking for letters of recommendation. Give a two-week minimum notice when asking for letters.

Remember if you do not have qualifying ACT scores you will need to take the Accuplacer test.

If you are planning to earn a teaching degree, you need to check with the college you are going to attend because you are probably going to have to take the writing section of the ACT.
