Mash applications are now available in the office. MASH, Medical Applications of Science Health is a two-week summer camp that introduces students to a variety of health careers. Applicants must be at least 16 at the time of the program. Students will shadow in a variety of health care locations, take part in hands-on activities to learn medical procedures, tour the medical school in Fort Smith, etc. Students take part in heart dissections and suturing, proper wrapping techniques and casting, etc. Students are required to attend Mon-Friday, 8-4 pm. Breakfast, lunch, and snacks are provided. Transportation is not provided. This program will be at either Baptist on June 15th-26th or Mercy June 1st-12th. The program is free and the deadline to apply is April 3rd, 2020.

Scholarships:

All UAFS scholarships require students to be college level on their ACT. College level requires students to have obtained at least a 19 in all subsections along with their composite score.

UAFS does not superscore ACT exams.

The John & Lee Ella McDonald Scholarship applications are available in Mrs. Wisdom's office – Deadline to apply is March 25, 2020.

The Roy & Mae Smith Scholarship is a one-year \$5,000 scholarship. Students must apply online. See Mrs. Wisdom for information. Deadline to apply is March 1, 2020.

SENIOR EVENTS AND INFORMATION:

Seniors, if your ACT score improved on this last ACT you will need to let the office know what colleges to send your updated scores to.

Seniors don't forget to be working on your resume and asking for letters of recommendation. Give a two-week minimum notice when asking for letters.

Remember if you do not have qualifying ACT scores you will need to take the Accuplacer test.

If you are planning to earn a teaching degree, you need to check with the college you are going to attend because you are probably going to have to take the writing section of the ACT.
