Current 10th-12th grade students who are 16 or older, applications are now available in Mrs. Wisdom’s office for the free MASH (Medical Applications of Science for Health) Program. It is a 2-week program for students interested in pursuing a medical career. During the 2-weeks, students will: Receive CPR training, maneuver through the heart while a surgeon directs their dissection, shadow 7 departments in a hospital including surgery and the ER, tour a medical school campus, etc...

Students must have at least a 2.75 GPA, have completed Biology, and be committed to attending the full 2 weeks. Students will be responsible for their own transportation each day. Lunch and snacks are provided. Mercy Fort Smith – June 3rd-14th and Baptist Fort Smith – July 1st-12th. Deadline to apply is March 29th.
