The deadline of July 1st for high school seniors to apply for the AR Challenge (lottery) Scholarship on the YOUNiversal portal is July 1st. This deadline does allow the June 13th student score to be considered for the minimum superscore of a 19.

All UAFS scholarships require students to be college level on their ACT. College level requires students to have obtained at least a 19 in all subsections along with their composite score.

UAFS does not superscore ACT exams.

If you can't join the sessions will be recorded and posted to their Youtube page. Schedule a one on one Virtual Appointment with us at linktr.ee/uafsfinaid.

If you had an appointment scheduled with AR Rehabilitation Services representative, Janie Crafford, on Wednesday, April 1st or Thursday, April 2nd – Please know she is not allowed to keep those appointments due to the virus. Students wishing to make an appointment must now call her and schedule an appointment to meet with her at her Booneville office. Every senior who had a previously scheduled appointment has her business card and the required paperwork. Janie's office number is 479-675-3835.

If you have not completed your FAFSA, you are reminded to do so. Your FAFSA must be completed in order for you to receive the AR Academic Challenge Scholarship.

If you are a senior who did not complete the Youuniversal application at scholarships.adhe.edu back in October with Mrs. Wisdom, come by the office and she will walk you through the process. If you did complete the application, you are reminded that you can log on to your account at any time to check the status of your account. Note – Arkansas Department of Higher Ed is letting seniors know their status is probably going to show “eligibility pending” for the AR Challenge Scholarship until the end of April because it will be at least that long before ADHE has FAFSA information loaded in their system.

If you would like to make an appointment to meet with a representative from AR Rehabilitation Services to determine if you would qualify for financial assistance for college tuition, see Mrs. Wisdom. Appointments will be held on Tuesday, March 31st.

Seniors, if your ACT score improved on this last ACT you will need to let the office know what colleges to send your updated scores to.

Seniors don't forget to be working on your resume and asking for letters of recommendation. Give a two-week minimum notice when asking for letters.

Remember if you do not have qualifying ACT scores you will need to take the Accuplacer test.

If you are planning to earn a teaching degree, you need to check with the college you are going to attend because you are probably going to have to take the writing section of the ACT.
