The PSAT/NMSQT WHICH IS THE Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test will be Wednesday, October 16th 1st-4th periods. If you want to take the test, you need to sign up with Mrs. Wisdom and Pay the \$17 by Tuesday, October 1st. The test measures the knowledge and skills you have developed in reading, writing, language, and math. You might want to take the exam if: 1. Your parent works for a company and the company requires this test score for its scholarship program. 2. You want to take it as a practice if you ever intend to take an SAT. 3. You think you could score very well on it so you might qualify for the National Merit Scholarship Program.

Scholarships:

UAFS Prestigious Scholarship deadline is November 15th and has a separate online application.

UofA Fayetteville Priority Scholarship deadline is November 15th and the admissions priority deadline is November 1st.

ATU-Russ Priority Scholarship deadline is November 15th.

ATU Foundation/Private/Alumni Scholarship deadline is also November 15th. Apply at arkansastech.awardspring.com

UCA Priority Scholarship deadline is December $10^{\rm th}$, October is the last ACT score UCA will consider for scholarships.

The UAFS 2020 Prestigeous Scholarship application is now available online @ https://admissions.uafs.edu/financial-aid/prestigious. Students must be fully admitted to the university in order to apply for Prestigious Scholarships. On a student's acceptance letter they are provided their Student ID number. This number is required for successful submission of the application. Deadline to apply is November 15, 2019.

UAFS Lion's Share is where seniors need to go to access and apply for UAFS Foundation Scholarships. More information about Lion's Share can be found at:

All UAFS scholarships require students to be college level on their ACT. College level requires students to have obtained at least a 19 in all subsections along with their composite score.

UAFS does not superscore ACT exams.
