

# BECKMAN HIGH SCHOOL EARLY COLLEGE COURSE SEQUENCE BY YEAR

The purpose of the Early College Program (ECP) is to provide the opportunity for academically qualified high school students to complete the Intersegmental General Education Course (IGETC) Certification and potentially an associate's degree (additional units are needed outside of ECP to obtain an associate's degree). The program is specifically designed to allow students looking to attend a UC or CSU campuses with almost two years worth of transferrable college credit, saving thousands of dollars in tuition and valuable time that can be directed toward a career or graduate work.

Classes offered through ECP are for college credit and carry the same rigor and content as the course offered on the IVC campus. All courses offered through ECP transfer to both the California State University (CSU) and University of California (UC).

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Early College students who would like to complete a 2-year associates degree from Irvine Valley College by the time they complete high school and the Early College Program will need to complete an additional 9 units of college credit. This can be done in one of three ways.

1. Complete additional college courses at IVC, another community college or university during the summer or regular school year. On average, most college courses are 3 units so students would most likely only need to take an additional 3 college courses.
2. Complete AP exams and get an appropriate score earning Irvine Valley College Credit.
  - Common AP Exams and IVC Credit
  - Art History (with a score of 3 or better on the AP exam) – 3 units of credit
  - Calculus AB (with a score of 3 on the AP exam) – 5 units of credit
  - Calculus AB (with a score of 4 or 5 on the AP exam) – 10 units of credit
  - Calculus BC (with a score of 3 on the AP exam) – 5 units of credit
  - Calculus BC (with a score of 4 or 5 on the AP exam) – 10 units of credit
  - Chemistry (with a score of 3 or better on the AP exam) – 4 units of credit
  - English Literature and Composition (with a score of 4 or better on the AP exam) – 3 units of credit
  - Environmental Science (with a score of 4 or better on the AP exam) – 4 units of credit
  - History -US (with a score of 4 or better on the AP exam) – 3 units of credit
  - Physics – All Tests (with a score of 3 or better on the AP exam) – 4 units of credit
3. Complete a combination of college and AP exam credit
