The chair explained that she has spoken to Mrs. Nardone who will accept the nomination and will be sworn in on January 6th when she returns from vacation. <b>REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT</b>	<p>Dr. Curtis-Whipple shared with the Committee about the loss of Mary Quinton. She shared the long history we have had with Mary and all she has done for our community. She expressed condolences to the Quinton Family.</p> <p>Dr. Curtis-Whipple shared that the primary schools are kicking off their enrichment clubs the second week of January.</p> <p>Many of our schools participated in various toy drives throughout the holiday season.</p> <p>Many of our students attended the Full STEAM Ahead (FACE* night at WHS). We wanted to thank Teri Flemming, Jeremy Angelos, and all of the STEAM teachers again for their work making this event possible. It was very widely attended.</p> <p>Grade 5 Computer Lit. students at Abigail Adams are learning about programming and debugging using resources on the site, “code.org.”</p> <p>As part of their participation in PBIS, Nash students have made a bulletin board of shout-outs to staff made by students.</p> <p>There will be a parent night in February centering around the issue of vaping. A doctor will present data and helpful tips for cessation.</p> <p>The next FACE event will be a community forum about ALICE**. We will be meeting in the Humanities Center on Jan. 9th from 6:00 PM - 7:00 PM. Representatives from the School Dept., The Fire Dept., and the Police Departments will be available to discuss the protocols surrounding our response to active shooter situations. It will be recorded by WETC for anyone who is unable to attend.</p>

<p><b>NEW BUSINESS</b></p>	<p><u>School Improvement Plan: Primary Schools</u>          Principals Jeremy Burm, Patrick Costello, Richard Bransfield, Elizabeth Drolet, Lori Gover, Kathy Guilfooy, Patrick Higgins, and Nancy Schuhwerk came to the table. They provided and summary of student performance data, the four performance challenges (Literacy, Mathematics, Family Engagement and School Culture, Social Emotional and Behavioral Development), Accomplishments and Key Initiatives and Resource Priorities. (Presentation attached to these minutes)</p> <p>Mrs. Palazzo highlighted the importance of the SIP process and said it was a good way for parents to get involved in the life of their children's schools.</p> <p>All questions asked by the Committee were addressed.</p> <p><u>Educational Technology Update</u>          Director Brett Lindholm and Coordinator of Infrastructure James Rekowski came to the table. They presented an update of year 4 of the 5 year plan. They provided an overview of staffing, infrastructure, devices and integration. (Presentation attached to these minutes)</p> <p>Dr. Sherlock-Shangraw asked if the one to one initiative extended to the night school. It does not yet.</p> <p>All other questions asked by the Committee were addressed.</p>
<p><b>OLD BUSINESS</b></p>	<p><u>Chapman School Building Update</u>          Review timeline for closing of chapman January - June 2020          Dr. Curtis-Whipple gave a broad overview of what will be happening over the next 6 months to facilitate the closing of Chapman Middle School. Dr. Curtis-Whipple shared that Weycare has moved out of the building, we are in the process of moving transportation out. Modularity will be installed at three primary schools in late spring.</p>

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	<p>Prior to vacation, Dr. Curtis-Whipple spoke with faculty and staff who would be impacted by staffing changes so they had a better understanding where they are going.</p> <p>As happens each year, several programs will be moving to different schools at the primary level and affected families were notified prior to winter break.</p> <p>There will be a parent meeting on February 11th at Chapman Auditorium for parents to ask questions. The community is welcome.</p> <p>Dr. Sherlock Shangraw asked a clarifying question regarding the work that will begin after April vacation. “Does that mean hard hats shovels in the ground?” Dr. Curtis-Whipple said there would be workers working in a sectioned-off part of the campus.
