



CAPS/GOWNS & GRADUATION ITEMS

All seniors should have already ordered their cap & gowns. If you are borrowing a cap and gown, you still must order a tassel. Call Graduate Services at 431-2541 or go online www.gradservicesltd.com to order. Cap/gowns and all other graduation items will be distributed during the senior activities in April.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

All fines must be paid before tickets to Prom, Grad Nite or Graduation will be issued. Students may pay financial obligations in the Business Office located in the front office anytime between 8:00am-4:30pm. TICKETS

Admission for Graduation is by ticket only. Each senior who will be marching will receive 10 tickets for Graduation. Children under 5 do not need a ticket for entry. Tickets will be distributed to the students at graduation practice the morning of June 6.

Grad Nite @ Magic Mountain!

WHERE: Magic Mountain, Valencia, California

WHEN: May 16-17



WHO: Seniors of Madera High School who are on track to graduate (200+ credits completed), have cleared all financial obligations, and are not on the Loss of Privilege list due to unexcused absences.

TIME: Meet at the Joe Flores gym for check in on May 16 at 3:00. Return between 10:00am and 12:00pm on May 17 at the Bus Loading Zone.

TRANSPORTATION: Charter Buses

*Secured overnight parking will be available for students that will need to leave their cars at MHS

TICKET\$: The cost of the ticket is \$150, which includes: round trip bus fare, admission, dinner buffet, unlimited use of attractions, FREE Hurricane Harbor return ticket, Kodak souvenir photo, dancing, and entertainment.

Sales: March 4 - <u>until sold out</u>. Space is limited to amount of bus seats we are able to reserve. To buy a ticket, each senior must come in person and bring:

- (1) Emergency Procedure Card signed by parent/guardian
- (2) Magic Mountain Parent/Guardian Acknowledgement Form
- (3) Cash/Check/Money Order for \$150
- (4) MHS Senior ID card

BU\$ A\$\$IGNMENT\$: Bus assignments are made at the time of ticket sale. If you want to be on the same bus with your friends, <u>buy tickets at the same time</u>. Bus seats are reserved on a first come first served basis.

MEDICATION: If a student needs to bring medication INTO THE PARK, inform MHS Activities Office, 675-4444, ext. 1196, NO LATER THAN MAY 10. Students are not allowed to carry medication while in the park.

DRESS: Anyone not dressed in accordance with Madera High dress code and Magic Mountain's guidelines will not be allowed to board the bus or enter Magic Mountain.

BEHAVIOR: Good manners and consideration for others are asked of the graduates to ensure everyone's fun. No alcoholic beverage/drugs/tobacco will be tolerated. All students will be checked when boarding buses and again at Magic Mountain. If anyone becomes a serious behavior problem, parents will be called and asked to pick-up the student. Magic Mountain sets all the rules of behavior, dress and transportation. No ice chests will be allowed on the bus.

REFUNDS: REFUNDS WILL ONLY BE GIVEN TO STUDENTS WHO HAVE CONFLICTING SCHOOL ACTIVITIES SCHEDULED FOR MAY 16-17 REFUNDS WILL NOT BE GIVEN FOR ANY OTHER REASON.

Grad Nite Dress Code

DRESS TO IMPRESS!

Acceptable for Everyone:

- Jeans
- Khakis or dress pants
- Jackets / Sweatshirts / Sweaters (gentlemen must wear a collared shirt underneath)
- Any apparel/clothing purchased at Six Flags Grad Nite
- Comfortable walking shoes are recommended

Gentlemen must wear a collared shirt. Polo or Button Down collared style shirts are acceptable.

Acceptable for the ladies:

- Purses (no larger than 8.5" x 11")
- Dresses or Skirts (no more than 3" above the knee)
- Capri's
- Blouses

Please note these important requirements NOT PERMITTED:

- No T-Shirts
- No Shorts
- No Backpacks or any large duffle bags
- No clothing affiliated with a school, sports team, group, club, etc. (i.e. letterman jackets, clothing with school logos, etc., including groups with matching shirts, pants, etc.)
- No clothing in poor condition (torn jeans and shirts, etc..
- No extremely revealing clothing (i.e. bathing suit tops or bottoms, tops showing midriff, seethrough clothing, etc.)
- No briefcases, hip packs (fanny packs), camera bags, tote bags, or oversized purses are allowed.
- No headwear of any kind (Hats, Bandana's or Beanies)
- No clothing or belts with spikes, sharp studs, chains- (no wallet chains)
