Reading

- Determine two or more themes or central ideas of a text, and analyze their development across culture, time, and media.

- Produce clear and coherent writing in which the development, organization, and style are appropriate to task, purpose, and audience.
- Develop & strengthen writing as needed by planning, revising, editing, rewriting, or trying a new approach, focusing on addressing what is most significant for a specific purpose and audience.
- Use technology to produce, publish, and update individual or shared writing products in response to ongoing feedback, including new arguments or information.
- Conduct research to answer a question; narrow or broaden the inquiry when appropriate; synthesize multiple sources on the subject, demonstrating understanding of the subject undue investigation.
- Write daily for a range of tasks, purposes, and audiences.
- Demonstrate command of the conventions of standard English mechanics and usage.
