This will ensure that all of the CSU's that you apply to will be able to access your scores. If you are applying to multiple UC's, reporting your score to just 1 UC will allow all of the UC campuses to view your scores once you submit applications to their campuses.

<u>Interested in becoming a teacher?</u> We have a special guest from CSU Fullerton to discuss the pathway to becoming a teacher! She will be presenting during the tutorial period on September 27, 2016. Please sign up on Naviance to participate and take advantage of this wonderful opportunity! <u>UC College Application Workshop</u>: With new changes to the UC application, particularly the Personal Insight Questions, we want all students to be better prepared to complete their applications. We will be hosting a representative from **UC Merced on October 17th, from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m.**, to cover changes on the application, and provide tips for the Personal Insight Questions. <u>Save the Date, October 19</u>: All Seniors will be getting registered to take the new, redesigned SAT during the school day. This is a FREE digital SAT exam with REAL, reportable scores. Students who are taking the October 1st paper SAT may also take the digital SAT on October 19th at THS. **This day is NOT a late start day!**

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#### **JUNIORS - CLASS OF 2018**

<u>Save the Date, October 19</u>: All Juniors will be registered to take the PSAT. The exam will free and will be completed during the school day. <u>It is NOT a late start day</u>. This is an important step for college readiness!

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#### **SOPHOMORES - CLASS OF 2019**

<u>CCR Academy</u>: Our next CCR, on <u>late start Monday 9/26</u>, Sophomore students will review TUSD's graduation requirements, A-G requirements for college admissions, and taking a self-reflection survey/quiz about college preparation and planning.

<u>Save the Date, October 19</u>: All sophomores will be registered to take a FREE Pre-PSAT exam through Schmoop. This is an online exam that will be completed during the school day. <u>This is NOT a late start day.</u> This is an important step for college readiness!
