We reviewed the following presentation which includes My AP steps to register, benefits of registering and important Total Registration deadlines, exams cost and payment options:

If your student is planning to take their AP Exam, here is a quick glance of the deadlines:

- October 1 Total Registration (Payment Service) opens
- November 8 Deadline to pay for exams on Total Registration with no late fee;
 Deadline for \$40/exam deposit for AP exams
- November 9-14 Timeframe to pay for exams on Total Registration with late order fee (\$10/exam)
- November 15 and beyond Deadline to pay for exams on Total Registration with extra late fee (\$40/exam); Case-by-case basis only.
- March 8 Deadline for those on partial payment plan to pay full balance on Total Registration.





WARNING SIGNS OF SUICIDE:

The behaviors listed below may be some of the signs that someone is thinking about suicide.

TALKING ABOUT:



- Wanting to die
- ▷ Great guilt or shame
- Deing a burden to others

FEELING:



- Empty, hopeless, trapped, or having no reason to live
- Extremely sad, more anxious, agitated, or full of rage
- Unbearable emotional or physical pain

CHANGING BEHAVIOR, SUCH AS:



- Making a plan or researching ways to die
- Withdrawing from friends, saying good bye, giving away important items, or making a will
- Taking dangerous risks such as driving extremely fast
- Displaying extreme mood swings
- Eating or sleeping more or less
- Using drugs or alcohol more often

If these warning signs apply to you or someone you know, get help as soon as possible, particularly if the behavior is new or has increased recently.


