Applications open for 2022-23 CCCOE Code.org Professional Learning Cohort ~ Scholarships Available ~

According to the <u>2021 State of Computer Science Education: Accelerating Action Through Legacy Report</u>, 50% of High Schools in Contra Costa County offer a foundational course in Computer Science.

California has on almost 76,000 computing jobs open each month, yet in 2018 there were only 7,311 CS graduates from California universities. CCCOE, in partnership with Code.org, offers a year-long professional learning program for Middle and High School teachers to learn how to teach CS with Code.org's free curriculum. Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis. Teachers can apply at <u>code.org/apply.</u> The cost for CCC teachers is \$1000 (a \$1500 savings) and full scholarships are available.

Health & ICT Day 2022

Contra Costa County Office of Education together with <u>Earn & Learn</u> sponsored two virtual career days this winter: One focused on healthcare careers and the other on careers in the information and communication technology sector. Estimated attendance was about 298 for the Health Careers Day and 265 for ICT Careers Day. Live attendees were able to ask the panels questions and received participant badges through Badgr. Recordings of the sessions are available on Earn & Learn's Vimeo page for future viewing.

For our Health Careers Day, we heard from Murray Athletic Development and the work they do with the Golden State Warriors to keep them in the game, from UCSF's Latinx Dental Group on their journeys to a career in dentistry and from Neurocrine Biosciences on working with patients with the most complex medical conditions. Contra Costa Community College District and i-Cultiver also shared their healthcare pathways.

On ICT Careers Day, we heard from Cyber Security experts at Palo Alto Networks and Red Box Business Solutions, a panel of entrepreneurs sharing their endeavors, such as partnering with Salesforce and using drone technology, and a panel of behind-thescenes tech experts who reflected on their journeys to their careers and the opportunities for all students available in ICT.

CCC ROP, in partnership with Chevron, offers training for high-paying careers in industrial facilities. This program, funded by the Chevron Richmond Refinery, is run by CCC ROP and has launched many successful careers in the fuels and petrochemicals industries. Over the last 7 years, CCC ROP has trained over 200 adults with half securing jobs at Chevron.





Students learn technical skills such as mechanics, mathematics and chemistry, along with communication and analytical skills, safety practices and how to work independently and as part of a team. They also receive job interview training.

The Control Award showcases teams that master robot intelligence. The award celebrates a team that uses sensors and software to increase the robot's functionality in the field. This award is given to the team that demonstrates innovative thinking to solve game challenges such as autonomous operation, improving mechanical systems with intelligent control, or using sensors to achieve better results.

Two Danville students make top 3 in DeSaulnier's App Challenge Chan from SRVHS second for Swype Words; Diablo Vista's Singh third with SmartHomework Planner

The honorees in U.S. Rep. Mark DeSaulnier's annual Congressional App Challenge included Danville students in second and third places, with a Walnut Creek student taking first place.

"It was such a pleasure reviewing all of the creative apps developed by students across Contra Costa this year," DeSaulnier said.

Jason Chan of San Ramon Valley High School took second place in the challenge, for an app aimed at promoting typing efficiency, called Swype Words.

Diablo Vista Middle School student Adhyayan Singh came in third, for an app aimed at helping students calculate and monitor their grades, called SmartHomework Planner.

Jason Chan is a CCC ROP student at San Ramon Valley High School. He has taken several courses in the Information and Communication Technologies pathway including:

First place went to Seth Raphael of Las Lomas High School in Walnut Creek, for an app called LinkJoin, which serves as a management and organization platform for virtual meetings, meant for use by educators, students, and other organizations.

"I am always impressed by the ingenuity and skill demonstrated by students in our district and congratulate this year's winner, Seth," DeSaulnier said. "In our increasingly digital world, his app can make the lives of both hardworking students and teachers easier."

The winners were selected by a panel of three judges with expertise in education and STEM. This year marks DeSaulnier's seventh participating in the Congressional App Challenge, which was established in 2014, with the goal of promoting education and interest in STEM amongst young people.
