## Applications open for 2022-2023 CCCOE Code.org Professional Learning Cohort

According to the <u>2021 State of Computer Science Education: Accelerating Action Through Legacy Report</u>, 50% of High Schools in Contra Costa County offer a foundational course in Computer Science.

California has on almost 76,000 computing jobs open each month, yet in 2018 there were only 7,311 CS graduates from California universities. CCCOE, in partnership with Code.org, offers a yearlong professional learning program for Middle and High School teachers to learn how to teach CS with Code.org's free curriculum.

Applications are reviewed on a rolling basis. Teachers can apply at <u>code.org/apply.</u> The cost for CCC teachers is \$1000 (a \$1500 savings) and full scholarships are available.

# Teacher Fellowships Applications Now Open for Summer 2022

Get Paid to complete Hands-on Summer PD!

Full-time K-16 teachers can now apply for Ignited's 2022 Summer Fellowship Program. Selected Fellows complete industry and research projects at companies and university labs, like Amazon Lab126 and Stanford Universities. **Teachers work full-time for 7 or 8 weeks** and are paid up to \$9,000 for completing an 8-week project with the <u>Summer Fellowship</u> <u>Program</u>.

Projects range in industry and subject, with the majority of in the STEM fields (science, tech, engineering, and math). Participants gain first-hand experiences in the applications of the subjects and skills they teach and are supported in infusing curriculum with "real world" connections that further engage students. Participants can also choose to earn 32 CEUs and/or apply for Ignited's Fund for Innovation, a competitive \$1,000 grant that supports new and exciting classroom ideas that improve teacher instruction and student achievement. **These projects begin to be filled in March, so it's best to apply ASAP**. CONCORD, CA-Ldya Dibeculu was one of 14 high school students in the Bay Area selected to participate in the UC Berkeley Society of Women Engineers High School Engineering Program (SWE HSEP). Society of Women Engineers is a national nonprofit organization which strives to highlight the achievements of women as leaders and engineers. (https://swe.berkeley.edu/hsep) Comprised of high school students and a group of dedicated mentors from UC Berkeley,



SWE HSEP fosters a nurturing environment for high school females to learn and explore their interests in engineering. Completed in November 2021, Ldya participated in the 10-week program, where the students receive engaging lessons pertaining to various fields of engineering and are mentored in small teams to design and carry out an involved engineering project. Ldya and her high school teammates designed a mini-golf course in the 3D modeling program AutoCAD. Ldya said, "Without any prior knowledge, I had to learn AutoCAD quickly and surprised myself when I was able to design and complete the mini golf course project. It was a great experience to collaborate with students from other high schools and very rewarding to see everything come together. I also enjoyed working with my mentor because she pushed me to keep trying despite the challenges I faced." Ldya is member in Clayton Valley Charter High School's Engineering Academy and is currently taking ROP Honors PLTW Computer Integrated Manufacturing. Ldya hopes to attend UC Berkeley next Fall and major in Civil Engineering. Congratulations Ldya in your tremendous achievement.
