School Security at all grade levels

students are struggling academicallyespecially math

Quarantine Support

New math program for elementary isn't going well at our school. Technology issues. Teachers aren't able to assign online work.

More instruction available to students on quarantine

Does everyone understand what it is that we are putting in writing. Is it meeting the level of comprehension of all of our parents?

Having a set plan in place and communication about what will happen if we have another closure.

Allowing more parental involvement

Less delay in communication to parents about staff and/or students testing positive for Covid. Expand Mandarin translations on district website, communications, and documents.

Lack of testing locations--need more

Rondo--dual immersion--improvements needed in regards to translations in Mandarin.

The emails we get that say "your child may be exposed" do not list the name of my child. I have 2 kids in 2 different classes so it would be nice to know which child was exposed.

Quarantine Learning

Why is CNUSD not allowing teachers to Zoom during instruction time for students who are on quarantine? Other districts are allowing their teachers to Zoom.

We need to improve on our pool of substitute para-educators. Safety can be a factor for our students. IEP's need to be implemented for all students. It would be great if substitutes can be trained in all programs and tools that our students are using daily. A faster process to recruit subs. Thinking outside the box because the needs with safety is a big problem. District needs to be creative with this issue. Students are not being able to attend without their one on one.

We need more IEP teachers in elementary schools. To help with the increasing number of kids who are enrolled.

Consistency across the district. Some schools allow 100 mile and students to mix during recess/lunch while others do not.

Inapproriate words being used on campus (e.g., boys saying inappropriate things in front of girls) consider a no tolerance of this kind of behavior.

Autism program was dismantled during covid. Right now we only have 2 TSA's that are overseeing this program and they have too many school sites to work with.

Teachers are struggling with not having subs for aides.

New math program is a struggle. The teachers are not being able to assign work to students because of technology issues.

Bowers is in desperate need of facilities improvements. The school does not have an outdoor area or pavilion to eat outside. Wheelchairs are getting to hot because of having to be sitting directly in the sun. Would like visibility. Please help with water that is not okay to drink parents are being asked to supply water. The feeding tubes need water and supplying water from the parents is being asked of them because the water at the school is not working

Parent education regarding cell phone restrictions;

Educating student about social media - Digital citizenship. Things on social media never go away.

Consider utilizing Parents on Point at a district wide level. Been very effective at several schools.

Another parent mentioned that when our kids are out sick with COVID-like, they are not excused unless they have a doctor's note. Is that correct? Some students have allergies or may get a cold with similar symptoms. Parents should be able to keep them home without seeing a doctor. Can we get clarification on that?

- -Please improve the selection of lunches at the elementary level. Maybe more in line with the middle school options.
- -All teachers should use Google Classroom at a minimum to post assignments to help parents monitor, support and ensure our students are completing assignments.

More after school programs. As well as more diversity in the options.
