- 5. What are your strengths and weaknesses?

- 7. Which one of your activities has given you the most satisfaction?
- 8. If you had high school to do over again, would you do anything different?
- 9. What particular "life goals" are you seeking to achieve or pursue?
- 10. What are your priorities in selecting a college?
- 11. How would you describe your high school and how would you change it?
- 12. Where do you see yourself in 4 years?
- 13. Discuss your most stimulating intellectual experience.
- 14. Tell me about something you have really wanted and had to go after on your own.
- 15. What is the most significant contribution you have made to your school?
- 16. What books or articles have made a lasting impression on your way of thinking? Have you read deeply into any one author or field?
- 17. Have you ever thought of not going to college? What would you do?
- 18. What will be the "good life" for you 20 years from now?
- 19. How would you describe yourself as a person?
- 20. If I handed you my telephone and let you talk to one living person, to whom would you talk? Why?
- 21. Why should we accept you at our college?
