#### Principals Corner- New Year, New Beginnings

Happy New Year! As we transition to 3rd quarter we have a lot of information to share with you. First of all, included with 2nd quarter grades being mailed out this week are two reports on your students PARCC results in Language Arts and Math from last year if you did not opt out of the assessment last spring. Usually, the state results are given to school districts in July, however due to the fact that last year was the first year PARCC was given, it took until this December to get the results out to school districts across the state. As you may of heard through the media, the results of this new assessment appear to show that our students are not achieving at a high level statewide. Looking at the results, students dropped significantly statewide using this assessment. However, anytime

there is a new assessment developed by the State, there is a period of transition that will show low scores until districts and schools adjust to the new measure.

For the first time, MVMS is partnering with the Colorado Division of Wildlife to facilitate Hunters Safety certification. Please refer to the article on page 2 for more information. We are always excited to bring in organizations from the community to increase the opportunities of our students to broaden their experiences and explore new interests. 

### MVMS/CODOW Hunter Education Course.

For the first time, MVMS is partnering with the Colorado Division of Wildlife to provide the opportunity for students to gain their hunter safety certification. The purpose of this course is to teach safe, responsible firearm handling in the field, in the vehicle, and at home after hunting. Through lectures, hands-on activities, and videos, students will learn about firearms and ammunition, firearm safety, shooting fundamentals, and wildlife laws. The final portion of the class will consist of a test and a short live-fire exercise where the students will shoot 10 rounds from a bolt-action .22 rifle. This class will take place at MVMS from 3:30-6:30 on February 16th,17th and 18th and on Friday the 19th from 8am to noon at the Monte Vista

DOW Service Center in Monte Vista. Participation in this class will be limited to the first 25 students who pick up and return the registration paperwork to the MVMS office completely completed by their parent or guardian. Although we will start the classes during school, students will need to arrange their own transportation home from the Middle School at 6:30 as well as to and from the DOW field office (one mile south of Pizza Hut on Henderson St) on Friday February 19th.
