Last week, the fifth grade team held their latest grade-level HAWK Community assembly. The purpose of our HAWK Community assemblies is to provide an opportunity for students and staff to come together to celebrate their community. Last week's assembly included an entire grade-level hula-hoop challenge as well as T.I.S. paraprofessional Mrs. Patty Jones conducting a Minute-to-Win-It game show.

During the hula-hoop challenge, students and staff created a chain by joining hands, followed by attempting to pass a hula-hoop around the entire cafeteria. 
Third grade: Third graders are exploring radial, concentric, spiral, and bi-lateral designs. They just created original sketches using these ideas and are now transferring the images to foil. Their designs will have a low relief (like a license plate) as they learn the technique of Repousse. Basically, they will work on the back side of the foil to indent it. When it is turned over, the raised relief will appear.

Fourth grade: Fourth graders have completed self-portraits and are studying masks and their various purposes. Students are just beginning to create their own masks that are based on characters in Greek Mythology such as Athena and Zeus. This is a multi-media project that will incorporate many skills learned in previous classes.

Fifth grade:




Students in fifth grade are learning the basics of transforming shapes into forms using one point perspective. They are creating 3-D objects in a 2-D space using lines that seem to "disappear" at a vanishing point on the horizon line. Ask your child to explain this technique; you will be surprised how easy it is to make these forms.



Mrs. Logsden - Health/Physical Education

3rd, 4th and 5th Health - **Trooper Steve Corradi, Tolland Public Schools Student Resource Officer** has come into each class to meet the students of TIS. The students have enjoyed meeting him and have asked some really great questions about his job and duties in the district. There are still a few more classes on the schedule, so if your child has not had the opportunity to meet Trooper Corradi yet, it will be coming up shortly.

Third grade: We are currently working on a nutrition unit using information from both *MyPyramid* and *MyPlate*. While maintaining focus on the nutritional basics, this unit allows us to work on other skills as well. Many games and activities are utilized throughout the nutrition unit also incorporating physical activity, math skills, social skills and proper game play etiquette. The book series, *Food is Categorical* by Brian P. Cleary is also embedded throughout the unit to support English and Language Arts.





Fourth grade: We are currently working on a nutrition unit using information from both *MyPyramid* and *MyPlate*. We have used information previously learned in third grade to advance further into the complexity of choosing the proper foods that provide growing bodies with the best nutrients. Vocabulary and knowing how we supply our body with the proper food energy sources are a large part of our nutrition unit. Nutrition based games and activities will be used to reinforced learned information and provide opportunities to practice social skills and proper game play etiquette. Ask your fourth grader to name the six essential nutrients, I have a feeling they will be proud to be able to tell you.

5th grade Physical Education – We are currently in a badminton unit. After a few days of skill work, fifth graders will be playing badminton games with modified rules. For some, serving the birdie has been a real challenge. In just two classes, so far there has been an amazing improvement from the students and their racquet skills. Some students will continue to work on making contact with the birdie, while others have advanced to controlling the birdie to reach a variety of targets. Your fifth grader should be proud of the improvement that they have made so quickly.

Third grade continues the Biography Unit with the life of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Last week students told me what they knew about MLK and then heard "The Picture Book of Martin Luther King". This week students will view and listen to a timeline of historical events so as to place MLK in the appropriate time period in history. In the following weeks, students will view video clips of Rosa Parks, the "I have a Dream" speech and the "Mountaintop" speech. Throughout the MLK lessons, students are encouraged to ask questions and to participate in discussions.

Fourth grade students have begun a hands-on "how do I find this book in the library" lesson. Students are asked to look up three titles in Destiny, one fiction, one non-fiction and one biography, then students must independently find these titles on the shelf. Finding the books is done in very small groups to allow complete independence and for Mrs. Hill to help, if needed.

Fifth grade Mr. Dineen has posted many book review posters written and designed by fifth graders. These posters can be found on the bulletin board in the school vestibule hallway, before the stairs leading up to the fifth grade classrooms. These book reviews are the first of many that will be posted throughout the year to promote our school-wide goal of reading improvement. All TIS students should be sure to check them out as most of the books that have been reviewed are excellent choices for grades 3, 4 or 5.

Mrs. Baker - Music/Chorus



Third grade general music: The students are learning how to read and play sixteenth note rhythm patterns while singing songs, playing instruments, stories, and writing rhythms. They are also learning about Mozart and Martin Luther King Jr. who were both born in January. While learning about Mozart the students be introduced to the musical forms of Rondo and Concerto.

Fourth grade general music: We have started our unit on the music of Africa. The students will be using syncopated and sixteenth note rhythm patterns in African songs, games, and recorder pieces. The students will play and learn about many of the instruments of Africa while singing, dancing, and learning folktales of the culture.

Fifth grade general music: The fifth grade students are learning how to number count more complex rhythms like one eighth note with two sixteenth notes and dotted quarter note rhythms. We will be reviewing the notes on the treble clef staff using multiple instruments and tonal activities. In preparation for composing on pitched instruments.

Fifth grade Chorus: We are off to an exciting start learning songs based on Aaron Copland, African culture, rap, patriotic and much more. Our concert on May 7, 2015 is sure to be tons of fun. Mark your calendars!!!

Fourth grade Chorus: The students are learning new music! They are doing a lot of fun pieces, such as "Papa Loves Mambo' and "Step In Time."

Fourth grade Band: The students are finishing up their rehearsals for their first band concert coming up next week! Almost all of the groups are learning eighth note rhythms, which is a brand new rhythm for them to start identifying in their music. Starting the last week of January, they will be given new music to work on for the next concert. This music will be actual music pieces, not pieces from the Standard of Excellence Book.

Fifth grade Band: The students are finishing up their rehearsals for their band concert coming up next week! Everyone is getting further in their Standard of Excellence Book 1. I am very proud of all of their hard work! They will be learning new pieces after next week's concert that will be a bit more challenging for their spring concert.

Mr. Downing - Physical Education



Third grade are now in the basketball unit. Students will be reviewing dribbling, passing and shooting.

Fourth grade is also into the basketball unit. Throughout the unit, the students will play a variety of games in order to reinforce the basketball skills of dribbling, passing and shooting.

Fifth grade has begun the badminton unit. Students will be introduced to basic racket skills and game play.





Mrs. Kirk - Technology Integration January

Students have been very busy with the ReadWorks program, learning how to use digital media to enhance and support their reading skills. Students are working on problem solving skills and using tutorials to review and self-monitor skills taught. Technology affords the

students the ability to learn perseverance and that mistakes often lead to greater learning and understanding.

Students are encourage to continue practicing their typing skills on a regular basis as well as their coding skills that began during the Hour of Code in December.

I encourage you to sit with your student and have them show you what they've been doing. Be the student and see if they can teach you something new.









Clinic #1: Infield/Outfield Fundamentals:

Baseball: 8-12 year olds

Sundays in February: 2/1, 2/8, 2/15, 2/22 TIME: 2:00-4:00 pm (FEBRUARY 1ST ONLY) TIME: 6:15-8:00 pm (February 8, 15, 22)

Place: Tolland High School

Cost: \$85.00

This program is designed to help improve all around defensive baseball skills from throwing and catching the ball properly, to improving footwork for infield/outfielder's, and attacking the baseball. Fielding drills will stress the importance of creeping on every pitch, anticipation/reaction, ground balls/fly balls, double plays, cutoff drills, communication, and basic game situations. Limited to 40 players ran by Todd Euliano (Coaching Coordinator/Director of Training and Development)

Clinic #2: Softball Clinic: (Hitting/Fielding):

Players will learn the correct swing plane, proper grip and stance through tee work and soft toss. Also, players will learn the art of bunting from both sides of the plate. We will focus on good throwing mechanics from a ready position, fielding position (while moving) along with cut off and ground ball drills. This clinic will also cover catching with 2 hands with and without gloves, communicating and base running techniques.

The clinic will be led by Tolland High School baseball coaching staff and current players who will focus on all areas of importance for each position. Pitchers will work on arm circle, grips, balance drills, pitching delivery, follow thru and completion of motion. Clinic will cover drills and techniques to improve consistency and velocity on the mound.
