Unified Arts Update for January 2018

Art ~ Library ~ Music ~ Physical Education

Art

It is with a sad heart that we say goodbye and good luck to our former art teacher Mrs. Bezzina.

She is off to pursue other endeavors and the whole TIS family wishes her well. We welcome Ms. Ballard, formally a Tolland Middle School art teacher, who joined the Unified Arts team here at TIS this month.

Ms. Ballard - Art Teacher

Third Grade; Students will be finishing up their painting projects they started with Mrs Bezzina. These projects focused on creating Space in a painting creating a background, middleground, and foreground.

Fourth Grade: Students will be be finishing up their Postcard projects they started with Mrs Bezzina. The students created symmetrical or asymmetrical designs on a small postcard. They will be starting the painting part of the project this week.

Fifth Grade: Students will be finishing up their Animal Sculpture projects they started with Mrs. Bezzina. Their next project will be a weaving.

Mrs. Hill - Library Media

Third grade: Students began a biography unit in January. They learned parts of a biography, then they read a short biography about Martin Luther King, Jr. They practiced note taking skills with a graphic organizer, picking out the important facts, using their text features skills. Then they read a short biography about MLK and used text features. Next, they will be writing their own autobiography.



Fourth grade: Students did a mini-research biography page on the life of Martin Luther King, Jr. in the first few weeks of January. Next, they will began a large research and writing unit in the classroom about animal adaptations. In collaboration with classroom teachers note taking skills, how to put a bibliography (works cited) page together and a graphic organizer to take notes will be lessons taught in library during January and February for this report. Students are very excited to learn unique and interesting facts about their chosen animal as they move throughout research stations in the library.

Fifth grade: Students did a mini-research biography page on the life of Martin Luther King, Jr. in the first few weeks of January. In preparation for classroom research and writing projects students will get a review lesson on note taking skills, putting a works cited page together and how to avoid plagiarizing.



Ms. Baker - Music/Chorus

I would like to welcome my student teacher Miss Katherine Roque from the University of Connecticut. She will be starting January 23.

The composer of the month for January is Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart

<u>Grade 3 general music:</u> The third grade students have started a new unit focusing on sixteenth note rhythms and rondo form. In addition, they will be learning folk songs based on Colonial Tolland which coincides with the third grade Social Studies curriculum.

Grade 4 general music: The fourth graders are learning about the music and geography of South America. They are playing games, instruments, dancing and singing songs in various South American languages. The students will be given the opportunity to earn their yellow, orange and green belts in recorder karate. Please remind your children that they need to bring their recorders to school for music day.

<u>Grade 5 general music:</u> The fifth grader students are creating, composing, performing, and analyzing music. They are composing in small groups using graphic notation, standard music notation, latin american instruments, and African instruments. They will begin learning to play the ukuleles mid- February.

Grade 4 Chorus: Chorus members are having fun learning new songs for future PBIS assemblies and their Spring concert. Ask your child to give you a musical preview of "Yonder Come Day", a song from the Georgia Sea Islands.



Grade 4 and Grade 5 Band: Both Bands gave a spirited and joyful performance to a packed house at Tolland Middle School on January 18th. Band students worked very hard to make their Winter Concert an amazing celebration of music and accomplishment! To all band parents and extended family members who make playing an instrument possible, thank you so much for providing this opportunity for your children and supporting our music program.

Grade 4 Band: The 4th grade Band is focused on learning new material for the Spring concert. One band arrangement is "Bugler's Dream" which is based on the Olympic fanfare theme. Band members played the main melody at the Winter Concert and will be learning an

expanded arrangement which includes harmony parts played by some of the instrumental sections of the Band. We are having a lot of fun with this piece!

Grade 5 Band: 5th Grade Band members have begun preparing music for their Step-Up Concert with the 6th grade Band on April 6th. Students will be identifying, counting and playing the dotted quarter note followed by a single eighth note rhythm pattern. At home, soon you will be hearing "Trumpet Voluntary" and a spirited arrangement of Mouret's "Rondeau".

The 5th Grade Band Step-Up Concert with the 6th Grade TMS Band is scheduled for Friday, April 6, 2018 at Tolland Middle School auditorium. 5th grade Band members report to the TMS Band room no later than 6:00 p.m. Both bands perform from 6:15 to 6:45 p.m. and then have the option of attending the Funtastic Friday Night Bash activities following the Step-Up Concert. 

1) Baseball Clinic: Offensive/Hitting Clinic:

-Baseball 8 year olds - 8th graders

-January-February: 1/28, 2/11, 2/18

-TIME: 6:00-7:30 pm @ Tolland High School

-Cost: \$85.00 (get all 3 clinics for \$70/clinic/player)

This program is designed to help improve your child's ability and confidence on the offensive side of the baseball. They will get three 90 minute sessions of pure offensive instruction where they will learn the importance of balance and timing throughout their swing, how to bunt a ball properly, and aggressive base running

skills. In addition, they will learn the importance of pitch counts and pitch selection. Limited to 50 players

2) Baseball Clinic: Infield/Outfield Clinic:

Baseball 8 year old – 8th graders

February: 2/25, 3/4, 3/11

TIME: 6:00-7:30 pm @ Tolland High School

Cost: \$85.00 (get all 3 clinics for \$70/clinic/player)

This program is designed to help improve your child's defensive skills from properly fielding a ground ball and a fly ball, to taking good routes to the baseball (both infield and outfield), to proper footwork. They will get three 90 minute sessions of pure defensive instruction where they will be taught the importance of understanding the both IF and OF positions. Limited to 50 players

3) Pitchers / Catchers Clinic:

Baseball 8 year olds - 8th graders

March: 3/1, 3/6, 3/8

TIME: 6:30-8:00 pm @ Tolland High School

(NOTE: time is different on pitchers/catchers from other 2 clinics)

Cost: \$85.00 (get all 3 clinics for \$70/clinic/player)

This program is designed to help improve pitchers/catchers. Pitchers will work on arm circles, grips, balance, delivery, release points, and follow thru as well as fielding their position. We will cover drills/techniques to help improve consistency and velocity. Catchers will work on primary/secondary positions, proper receiving, blocking, pop-ups, fielding the bunt, and throwing to bases. Clinic will cover drills

and techniques for young catchers to improve defensively in all aspects of the position. Limited to 50 players
