



## **Course Syllabus**

### **Spanish 3 - Spring 2023**

**Instructor: Señora Felisa**

- I. Course Description:** In this course students will increase their communicative competencies in the four basic language skills of speaking, listening, reading, and writing. The third level course is an honors course and therefore students will focus specifically on their abilities to communicate in the four modes of communication allowing students to handle more complex elements of the language. Students will continue to learn about cultural aspects through geography, history, and literature selections as in levels 1 and 2, but whereas the focus in level 1 was ME, level 2, My World; level 3's focus is The World Around Me. The course is taught primarily in Spanish.
- II. Course Objectives:**
1. Ability to conjugate verbs in the present, past and future tense with specialized tenses.
  2. Acquisition of more complicated grammatical structures specific to the target language. For example: pronouns, reflexive verbs, adverbs, and adjectives
  3. Ability to use acquired vocabulary and knowledge of grammatical principles in order to express original thoughts, both oral and written
  4. Acquisition of increased reading comprehension, writing, speaking and listening skills. Able to interpret and manipulate in oral and written form narrative and expository texts.
  5. Acquisition of cultural information in such areas as famous individuals of the target language, traditions, and cultural comparisons

### **IV. Grading Policy:**

Test grades will account for 70% of the 9-weeks grade, with the remaining 30% being determined by homework, quiz and daily grades. The grading scale is as follows: A (90-100), B (80-89), C (70-79), D (65-69), and F (below 65). Grades will be a reflection of mastery of the standards and proficiency skills. Make sure all absences are excused as class work can be made up and graded for excused absences only. The Final Exam counts for 20% of the final grade.

### **V. Make-up Test Policy:**

Tests are made up during the Refuel hour any day **except** Tuesday or Friday in room A118. Each student will have 2 opportunities in a two week time frame to make up a test or quiz before a grade of 0 becomes the final grade. Any missed assignments are due within 3 days of returning to school.
