ACP Oakland is a closed campus. Students will not be allowed to leave the campus between classes. CUSD Food Services will provide a free breakfast and lunch each day.

- ENROLLMENT: Summer Academy courses will only be carried upon sufficient enrollment.
- <u>CODE OF CONDUCT</u>: During the summer session, all students are expected to adhere to Chandler Unified School District's Code of Conduct at all times.
- <u>DRESS CODE</u>: Students are expected to adhere to the CUSD Dress Code during Summer Academy. For
 dress code violations, students are sent to the front office to call home for a change of clothing. Repeat
 occurrences will result in a parent meeting.
- TRANSPORTATION: If you are in need of transportation, please select and add transportation services to your online registration. Students will be picked up/dropped off from their home junior high school then transported to ACP Oakland. Don't forget to obtain the transportation approval code from your school counselor.
- MAPS: Maps of classrooms and locations will be available online and the first day of class at ACP Oakland.
- BREAKFAST and LUNCH: Both are served daily at no additional cost. Please refer to your course information for the lunch time.
- ATTENDANCE & TARDIES: Students are allowed to miss up to 2 days of Summer Academy. If they miss a third day, the student will be dis-enrolled with no credit earned and no refund. Three tardies equal one absence. Thirty minutes or more late to class equals an absence. Leaving early from a class 15 minutes or more during the day is also equivalent to one absence.
- FINAL EXAMS: Final exams are given on the last day. All students must attend the last day. An absence on the last day WILL jeopardize credit for the course. All fees are non-refundable.
- GRADES: Summer Academy grades will NOT be mailed. Final Grades will be posted to the Student Portal




