

#### A NOTE ABOUT REPORT CARDS



The last report card of the year will be printed and a hard copy sent home with the students on the last day of school.



This summer Tolland Intermediate School is pleased to partner with the State of Connecticut Commissioner of Education to bring you the Commissioner's Summer Math Challenge: Solving the Mystery of Math. This program is designed to help students retain the math skills they have learned during the previous school year.

Students in grades 1-8 are welcome and encouraged to participate in this **FREE** online program. Students will need to register online and will receive daily emails with activities and online work to be completed over the summer months. This free math maintenance program is sponsored by Metametics and is based on grade-level standards to help students continue to practice their math skills. There is also a paper math log to be completed when your child returns to school in the fall.

Similar to the Governor's Summer Reading Challenge, this program provides incentives for participating districts as well as certificates for participating students. Tolland Intermediate School participants will also earn a special prize for their participation. ### How do you get a Quantile student measure?


Quantile measures are available from many year-end state tests, as well as from other classroom tests and math programs.




