

# **K12 Course Guidance**

How to adapt courses to account for lack of materials and limited Learning Coach availability.

This document is intended for **those who are using K12's courses but don't have access to their full materials kits**. It will help you know which parts of the course will most likely work best for you and which you might adapt or avoid due to a materials dependency. It will also help you understand where students are able to complete lesson work independently and where Learning Coach/Teacher guidance is necessary (identified as "Most Robust Path" vs. "Simple Path").

## **Safety Alert**

K12 takes the health and safety of its students, their families, and the communities in which they live very seriously. As a result, please omit all activities in any course which require you or your student to leave your home to complete the activity, or to gather supplies for it, until social distancing guidelines or mandates related to the COVID-19 virus are relaxed to the appropriate level in your area.

#### **Materials**

We are providing e-book or PDF versions of course books/materials where we can. In some cases, though, courses call for books that must be acquired externally. See specifics regarding books and other materials adaptations within each course section.

Some courses require students to complete work offline on activity book pages/activity sheets. Where PDFs or Word docs of these are linked in courses, students should print the pages if they have access to a printer. If printer access is not available, students can simply refer to the digital files and write their answers on their own paper.

#### Accessibility

K12 is committed to ensuring that its courses and resources are accessible to all users. Our goal is for all our courses to meet the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines Version 2 (WCAG 2.0 Level AA) recommendations of the World Wide Web Consortium (W3C). The range of curriculum provided and the dates it was created and updated may affect current accessibility in some instances, but newer curriculum and resources are very close to this goal, while legacy elements are in iterative updates to bring more of these resources into accessibility compliance. #### **Mobile Readiness**

K12's courses are usable on both desktop/laptop computers and tablets, with some usability on mobile phones, though desktop/laptop use provides the ideal experience. In terms of mobile devices, tablets will provide the best experience.

#### **Assessments**

K12's courses include a variety of assessment formats:

- Online, Computer-Scored
   Learning Coaches/Teachers do not need to do anything with these assessments. They are embedded online within the courses, and the system handles submitting and scoring them as students complete them.
- Offline, Teacher-Graded Some assessments, such as writing assignments, must be submitted to teachers for grading. In Middle School and High School teacher-graded assignments are submitted via a Dropbox tool within the courses. In the K-5 courses, a Dropbox tool is not available. In these cases, teachers should communicate an assignment submission plan that will work for their students. This might include emailing assignment documents, sending teachers a link to a Google doc, sending teachers a photo of a completed assignment, etc.
- Offline Observational, Learning-Coach Evaluated
   Offline observational assessments (grades K-2, and sparingly in science and social studies 3-5)
   are led and evaluated by Learning Coaches. In these assessments, Learning Coaches ask
   students to perform a task, and then evaluate the student's response. For example, the
   Learning Coach might ask students to sort a set of blocks by color, and then record the result
   online for grading. Teachers may be able to conduct observational assessments via a video

  - Students may develop and execute simple experiments and models with adult supervision.
- For grades K-5, planning and executing some kind of science-based activity is more important than doing a specific activity. Students may make plans, models, or perform experiments.

#### Plan Guidelines

- A question about a phenomenon or observation
- A hypothesis that tries to answer the question
- A description of an experiment that describes a thing (variable) they will change and the thing (variable) they will observe or measure

## Experiment guidelines

- Record observations.
- Make conclusions based on observations.

#### Model guidelines

- Observe a phenomenon through videos, photographs, or in the real world.
- Create a sketch or diagram that attempts to explain it in their own words.

- Try to find (research) other explanations about the phenomenon or other examples of the phenomenon.
  - Students may create a model of a phenomenon before learning the topic, and then revise their model after working through the lesson. It's important that they try to explain something, and then revise their explanation after they learn something new.
- Revise the original model based on the new information.

#### Most Robust Path

- Perform all online activities.
- For each hands-on activity, do one of the following:
  - Use household materials to complete the activity.
  - Sketch a design that would help you investigate the phenomenon described in the original activity.
    - Note: Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) strongly encourage students to develop models and plans to explain scientific phenomena.
       Making a plan to test a phenomenon is just as important as performing a lab.
  - Design and execute a new way of doing the activity.

## Simple Path

- Complete the online activities.
- Skip the hands-on activities.

# **K5 History Summit**

## **K5 History K-4 Summit**

Students work mainly online but there are a few hands-on offline activities, such as coloring, labeling maps, and various forms of artwork. Short stories called *online books* have audio, or the Learning Coach/Teacher can read the short stories to the student. The Learning Coach and Student Guides are available online within each lesson. A materials list is provided with each lesson. Materials consist mainly of household items, except for a globe and various maps, which can easily be found on the Internet. Additional reading and picture books are listed as optional materials.

## Most Robust Path

- Follow the instructions in the Learning Coach and Student Guides.
- Complete the online and hands-on offline activities including the optional activities.
- For lessons that specify the use of a globe, Google Earth is an excellent place to view
   3D images of the world.
- For lessons that specify the use of a map of the world or the United States, the Central Intelligence Agency's World Factbook has excellent printable maps for you to use.
- A few lessons contain activities which require reading physical, specific books with your students. While these books are unfortunately not available online, please know in

some cases you and your student can still complete the rest of the lesson. When that is not possible, please omit the lesson.

#### Simple Path

- Follow the instructions in the Learning Coach and Student Guides for all online activities.
- Omit the hands-on offline activities.
- o Omit any activities that require materials that are not available.

## **K5 Early American History Summit**

This course uses a set of two textbooks—A History of US (Concise Edition), Volume A (Prehistory-1800) and A History of US (Concise Edition), Volume B (1790-1877) both by Joy Hakim. Links to digital versions of these textbooks can be found in the Learn: Introducing American History A activity in Unit 1, Lesson 1.

The course also uses the book *Understanding Geography: Map Skills and Our World (Level 5)*. No digital version is currently provided. You will need to either acquire this book, or skip the activities that rely on this book until the remainder of your materials arrive.

Student Guides and Answer Keys are available online within each lesson. Activity pages, which are used to reinforce the reading, are also available online.

#### Most Robust Path

- Follow the instructions in the Student Guides.
- Complete the online and offline activities, including the textbook reading assignments.

#### Simple Path

- Option 1:
  - Follow the instructions in the Student Guides for all online activities.
- Option 2:
  - Use the textbook and complete reading assignments and activity pages offline.

## **K5 Art Summit**

Lessons include online instruction and offline art projects. Younger students (nonreaders/early readers) will likely need Learning Coach/Teacher support to complete the online activities and art projects, though the screen-reader tool can provide some reading support.

When selecting units/lessons to complete, consider first looking at the related art projects; choose units/lessons with art projects that can be completed with materials on hand. In many cases, you can substitute materials students don't have on hand with materials they do have. For example, turn a painting project into a coloring project.

The art prints from the Art Print Kit listed in Materials can be ignored because all art images are online.

Some lessons, mostly unit review and checkpoints, include an activity based upon an art book. Either skip these reading activities until the remainder of your materials arrive or check to see if your library has an online version.

## **K5 Art K-4 Summit**

- Most Robust Path: Work with students to complete both the online activities and related art projects together.
- Simple Paths: Provide students with materials to complete just the art projects, skipping the
  online activities. Another alternative path is to just complete the online portion of lessons if
  students do not have materials on hand.

## **K5 Early American Art Summit**

Students should generally be able to complete both the online activities and related art projects on their own, so "robust" vs. "simple" paths are not suggested. If students do not have some of the project materials on hand, in many cases you can substitute with what they do have. For example, turn a painting project into a coloring project.

# **K5 Physical Education Summit**

## **K5 Physical Education with Lessons Summit**

Some activities require household materials for students to perform the activity. If students do not have those specific materials on hand, they can omit them if it is not possible for them to find a similar item at home. You may also omit activities for which students are unable to be supervised or those that are not appropriate for your student.

## **K5 Physical Education 3-5 Summit**

Some activities require household materials for students to perform the exercise. If students do not have those specific materials on hand, they can omit them if it is not possible for them to find a similar item at home. For example, if the activity calls for a pedometer, many smartphones or smart watches track steps and distance. You may also choose to omit activities for which students do not have the supplies for, such as a jump rope or playground ball. You may also omit activities for which students are unable to be supervised or those that are not appropriate for your student.
