- **This woman was horrified by the living conditions the new immigrants to America had to suffer, so in 1889, she turned a run-down house in the middle of Chicago into the Hull House; a place to help new Americans find a job, opened a day care/ kindergarten, ran English classes, exposed the poor to art, adjust to life in the United States, and much more.**



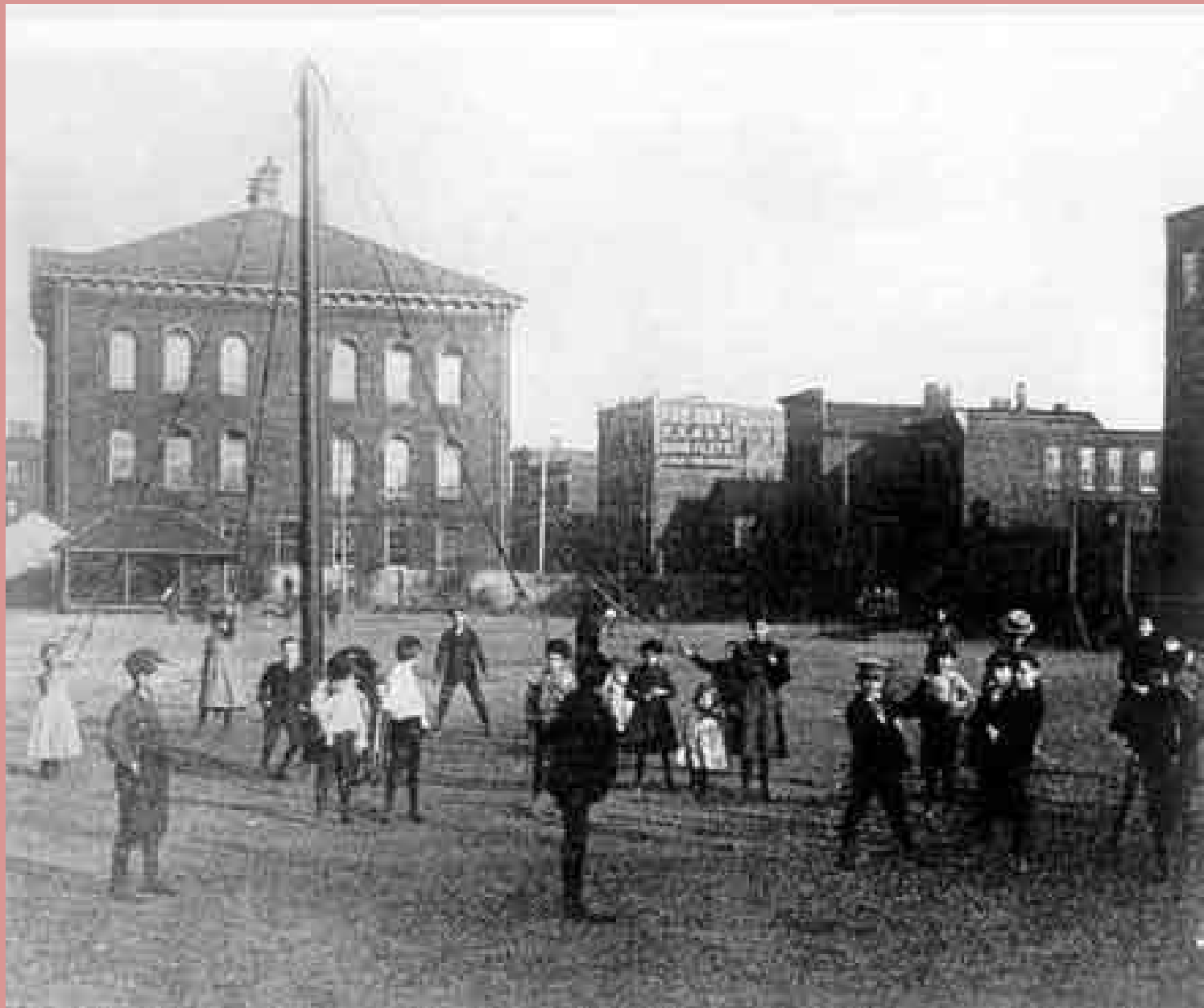

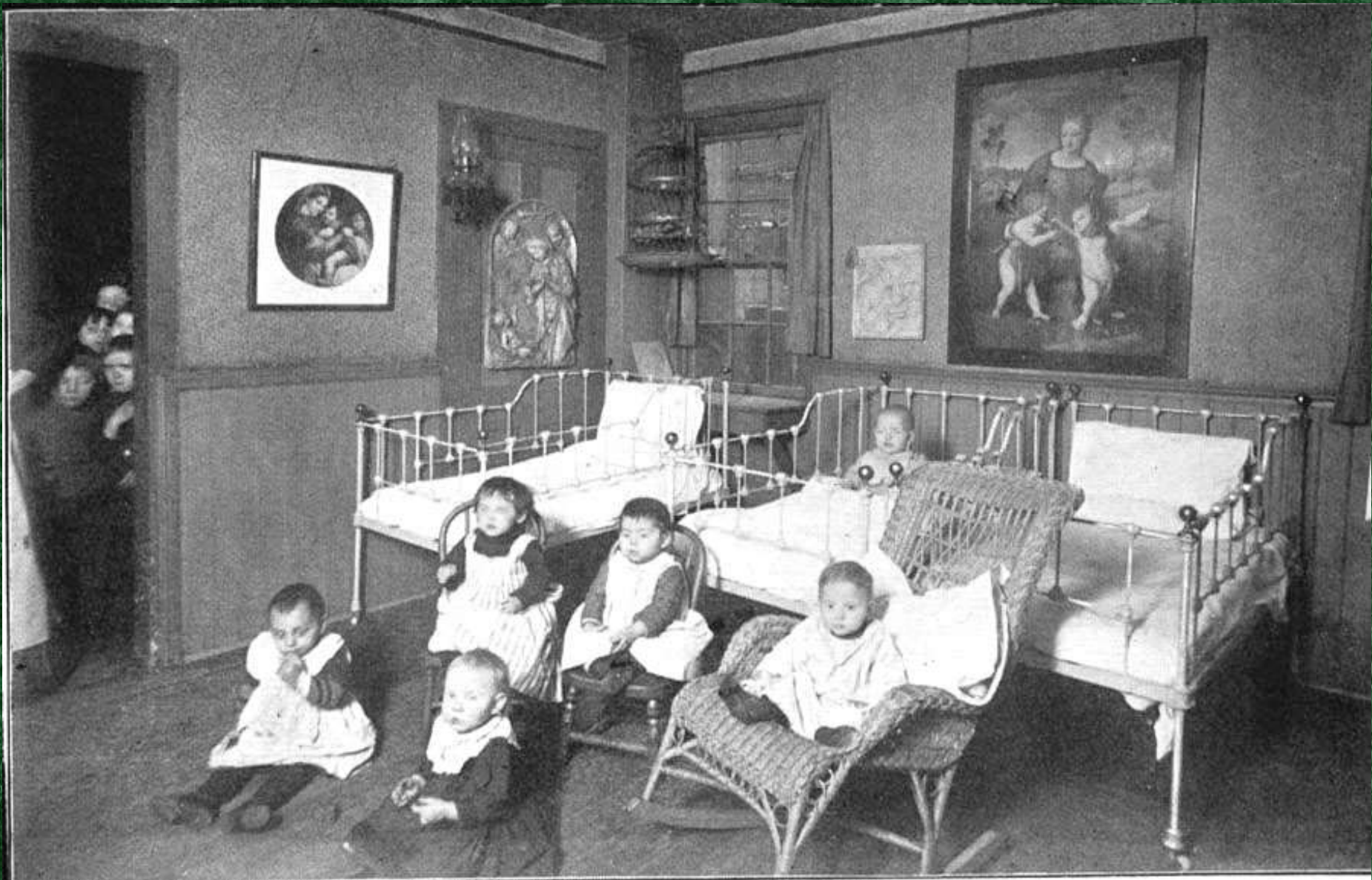


The Hull Mansion pictured here is the sole remaining building at the location of the original Hull-House. The rest were demolished to make way for the Chicago campus of the University of Illinois.
