*<u>ATTENDANCE</u>: Any student enrolled in the Waterbury School System in grades K - 12, whose absences equals 20 days, will automatically receive a grade of incomplete for all subjects. **WE EXPECT STUDENTS IN SCHOOL EVERYDAY!!!**

BOARD OF EDUCATION DRESS CODE POLICY: No denim jeans, leggings or T-shirts

<u>Boys</u>: pants or shorts in solid navy blue, black, gray or khaki **shirts** must be oxford or polo with sleeves and a collar or turtleneck in <u>solid</u> white, black or blue

<u>Girls</u>: jumpers, skirts, dresses, pants, or skorts in <u>solid</u> navy blue, black, gray, or khaki. (knee length skirts, jumpers, dresses, or skorts)

tops must be oxford or polo with sleeves and a collar or turtleneck in <u>solid</u> white, black, or blue

Gym Day Attire for Boys and Girls: Students may wear sweats in solid navy blue, white, or gray

<u>Optional</u>: V neck cardigan sweater, blazer, suit jacket, vest, or fleece sweater must be without a hood, in a v - neck, crewneck, or with a zipped collar style in <u>solid white</u>, black, or blue

Footwear: Shoes or sneakersNO flip-flops, open toe, or open back shoes.

*If your child is out of dress code, you may be contacted to bring appropriate clothing/shoes to school that day.

Parent's Corner

DID YOU KNOW......

Chronic absenteeism can have a drastic impact on your child's education. Missing 2 days in one month of school can be considered chronic absenteeism. Being absent 10 percent of the school year is chronic absenteeism. Children chronically absent in kindergarten and first grade are much less likely to learn to read by the end of third grade. By the sixth grade chronic absence is a proven early warning sign of drop-out from school. By the ninth grade, good attendance can predict graduation even better than test scores. Clearly, going to school regularly matters.

Students have been working on tapping and writing cvc words. It is very important that your child reads every night. Please check their folders daily for homework. Make sure homework is completed, signed and returned in their folders.

Happy Autumn! Our second graders are off to a fantastic start this year! In Math, we are studying addition and subtraction strategies, learning how to solve story problems, and learning about graphs. In Literacy, we are working on story elements and character traits.

Please remember to check your child's homework each night for completion. Please read aloud with your child each evening, and make sure your child dresses appropriately for the cooler weather.

Third grade is off to a great start! The students are busy reviewing the ROARS expectations daily. Positive behaviors are rewarded and allow us to make learning more enjoyable. Welcome back Kingsbury Families! 4TH grade has spent the last few weeks practicing routines, procedures and completing beginning of the year testing! Continue to have students read 20 minutes (Monday through Thursday), practice multiplication facts and complete math homework. As questions or concerns arise, feel free to contact us with a note or a phone call. We are off to a great start and are excited about the year ahead! ROAR!!!

Grade 5 - Mr. Bisaillon, Ms. Dibella, Mr. Morrissey

The 5th grade team is off and running and we are well into our Unit 1 lessons for English and Language Arts where we are learning all about the components of mystery stories and mystery writing. In math, we are learning about adding and subtracting fractions with uncommon denominators as well as adding and subtracting decimals. We had our first Science experiments and the kids did a great job learning while having fun. Testing for both Math and Reading are ending and you should expect to see student assessment results to be sent home soon! It is also getting colder and the kids have the sniffles and runny noses.
