

- Students are responsible for supplies and materials, as no sharing is allowed.




Lighthouse Leadership School

Laptops

The price for lunch is \$2.25. Extra milk may be purchased for \$.50.



Breakfast Procedures

Breakfast may be purchased each day for \$1.25. It will be available "To Go" from the cafeteria cart as students enter the building.

Cafeteria Rules: Students should exhibit proper manners while standing in line as they wait to pay for and receive their food, as well as, while eating in the classroom. Lunchroom courtesy and good behavior are essential.

HONOR ROLL & PRINCIPAL'S LIST

Students in grades 3-5 who attain all A's on their report card during the nine weeks grading period will be placed on the Principal's List for that grading period.

Students in grades 3-5 who attain all A's & B's on their report card during the nine weeks grading period will be placed on the Honor Roll List for that grading period.

Grades will be assigned to completed independent practice and assessments. This will include in person and remotely.

Attendance Policy

Attendance in school is an integral part in developing a positive attitude toward school and the teaching-learning process. Regular attendance develops patterns of behavior essential to academic achievement and personal success in life. Therefore, absences, tardies, and early checkouts should be limited to illness or other extenuating circumstances.

NC General Statue 115C-378 requires that every child between the ages of seven and 16 years (or younger if enrolled) attend school. Parents/legal guardians have the responsibility for ensuring that students attend school daily and "shall notify the school of the reason for each known absence in accordance with local board policy." For a child to be counted present, he/she must be in attendance at least one half of the school day. Anyone who checks out before 12:00 or checks in after 12:00 is counted absent. Be prepared to show identification when checking out your student.

On the day returning after an absence, a note must be given to the child's homeroom teacher that includes the dates of the absence, reason for the absence, and parent's signature. All notes are kept on file in the office. Absences will be considered excused for the following reasons only: See also OCS Board Policy 4400

- 1. Personal illness or injury; quarantine (of student)
- 2. Death of an immediate family member (parents, siblings and grandparents of the student)
- 3. Educational opportunity approved in advance by the principal (Family vacations and trips are not educational opportunities.)
- 4. Medical or dental appointments for the student only
- 5. Court/administrative proceedings for the student
- 6. Religious observances (approved in advance)
- 7. Military family leave (See Board Policy 4400)

All other absences are considered unexcused.

*All tardies are marked as unexcused unless a doctor's note is presented upon check-in.

Perfect Attendance certificates will be awarded at each grading period to students who have been present everyday and have not been tardy or checked out early.

Language Arts



During our Language Arts block, our lessons focus on Common Core standards and skills. We will utilize whole group, small group, independent, and one-on-one learning activities.



Reading

Reading lessons focus on practicing skills and strategies to help students improve their own personal reading abilities. Reading comprehension, decoding, accuracy, and fluency are stressed.

Writing

Writing lessons are used to help students learn about the different types of writing, the writing process, and revising & editing. Interactive writer's notebooks are used.


















Science



All 3rd grade students in North Carolina take the Beginning of Grade and End of Grade state assessments.







Read to Achieve

- Pathway to 3rd grade proficiency
- Portfolio 12 books each coordinates with a priority standard
 - Must pass all 12 to demonstrate proficiency in Reading
- Students must get 11 out of 15 on each standard to be considered proficient for that standard
- Work on these books continues all school year
- There is an RTA End-of-year exam for students who did not reach proficiency during the year.
- Students who are unable to reach proficiency through the books or the end-of-year test, will qualify for Reading Camp

BOG / EOG

NC Read to Achieve

3rd Grade Beginning-of-Grade (BOG)

- BOG pre-assesses student reading ability (3rd grade standards)
- Provides indicators (areas of focus) for addressing strengths and challenges in reading
- Multiple-choice format (read and answer questions)
- Read selections and answer questions (Fiction/Non-Fiction)
- Scores ranges Level 1 (lowest) to Level 5 (highest).

NC Read to Achieve

End-of-Grade (EOG)


- Measures progress towards mastery on 3rd grade standards
- EOG assesses reading and math
- Multiple-choice format
- Read selections and answer questions (Fiction/Non-Fiction)
- Scores ranges from Level 1 (lowest) to Level 5 (highest).

OCS COUNTY SCHOOLS

If student gets 3 or higher on either the BOG or EOG they have demonstrated proficiency on 3rd grade ELA.

These will be completed in a paper/pencil format.
