School Description

Lake Arrowhead Elementary School is located in the northwestern region of Lake Arrowhead and serves students in grades pre-kindergarten through five following a traditional calendar. At the beginning of the 2020-21 school year, 462 students were enrolled, including 12.1% in special education, 12.8% qualifying for English Language Learner support, and 54.1% qualifying for free or reduced price lunch.

Student Achievement

Physical Fitness

In the spring of each year, Lake Arrowhead Elementary School is required by the state to administer a physical fitness test to all students in grade five. The physical fitness test measures each student's ability to complete fitness tasks in six major areas. Students who either meet or exceed the standards in all six fitness areas are considered to be in the "healthy fitness zone." The chart reported in this document reports only the percentage in each category, not a cumulative total of the results for categories 4 of 6 and 5 of 6. California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress

The California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) System includes the Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments (SBAC) for students in the general education population, and the California Alternate Assessments (CAAs) for students with the most significant cognitive disabilities. Only eligible students may participate in the administration of the CAAs. CAAs items are aligned with alternative achievement standards. which are linked with the Common Core State Standards (CCSS). CAASPP results are a measure of how well students are mastering California's standards in English language arts/literacy (ELA) and mathematics, and are given to grades three through eight and grade eleven. SBAC tests assess student performance in ELA/Literacy and mathematics utilizing computer-adaptive tests and performance tasks, and CAAs test items are aligned with alternative achievement standards which are linked with the Common Core State Standards (CCSS).

The CAASPP results shown in this report include overall results comparing the school, district and state scores as well as the school's overall score in each applicable subgroup. Results are shown only for subgroups with ten students or more taking the exam. For those categories that are blank in the tables, no students met subgroup criteria. School Facilities & Maintenance

The district takes great efforts to ensure that all schools are clean, safe, and functional through proper facilities maintenance and campus supervision. Lake Arrowhead Elementary School's original facilities were built in 1960; ongoing maintenance and campus improvements ensure facilities remain up to date and provide adequate space for students and staff. District maintenance and site custodial staff ensure that the repairs necessary to keep the school in good condition are completed in a timely manner. A work order process is used by school and district staff to communicate non-routine maintenance requests. Emergency repairs are given the highest priority. In the last 12 months, the following improvements have been completed:

2020-21 Campus Improvements:

- · Seal coat and crack fill parking lot
- · Complete fascia repairs and repaint exterior of campus
- Replacement of gas line on campus
- Repaint library wing and classrooms, kitchen, front office and health room
- Installation of touchless faucets and flush valves in restrooms
- Installation of A-frame gates and bollards at parking lots
- Repaired water pipe in front of the school
- Repair fire alarm system in kinder area

Every morning before school begins, the custodian inspects facilities for safety hazards or other conditions that need attention prior to students and staff entering school grounds. One day custodian and one evening custodian are assigned to Lake Arrowhead Elementary School. The custodians are responsible for:

- Classroom cleaning
- Groundskeeping
- Lunch area setup/cleanup
- Restroom cleaning & stocking
- Snow removal
- Trash removal
- Event setup/cleanup
- Office area cleaning
- Lock & secure campus

The principal communicates with custodial staff daily concerning maintenance and school safety issues.

Facilities Inspection

The district's maintenance department inspects Lake Arrowhead Elementary School on an annual basis in accordance with Education Code §17592.72(c)(1). Lake Arrowhead Elementary School uses a school site inspection survey to identify unsafe or hazardous conditions and facility improvement needs. The most recent school inspection took place on Wednesday, October 13, 2021. No emergency repairs were needed and no unsafe conditions were found. During fiscal year 2021-22, all restrooms were fully functional and available for student use at the time of the inspection.

Rating Description

Exemplary: The school meets most or all standards of good repair. Deficiencies noted, if any, are not significant and/or impact a very small area of the school.

Campus Supervision

School administration and teaching staff place a high priority on providing adequate adult supervision on campus before, during, and after school. As students arrive on campus each morning, teachers are strategically assigned to designated entrance areas and the playground. Noon duty supervisors monitor all recesses and lunch time activity in the cafeteria and on the playground. At the end of the day when students are dismissed, administration and teachers monitor student behavior to ensure a safe and orderly departure.

Lake Arrowhead Elementary School is a closed campus. During school hours, all visitors must sign in at the school's office with a valid state issued identification to be scanned through the Raptor security system and wear identification badges while on school grounds.

School Site Safety Plan

The Comprehensive School Site Safety Plan was developed for Lake Arrowhead Elementary School in collaboration with local agencies and the district office to fulfill Senate Bill 187 requirements. Components of this plan include child abuse reporting procedures, teacher notification of dangerous pupil procedures, disaster response procedures, procedures for safe arrival and departure from school, sexual harassment policy, and dress code policy. The school's most recent school safety plan was reviewed, updated, and discussed with school staff in August 2021.

Classroom Environment

Discipline & Climate for Learning

Lake Arrowhead Elementary is a PBIS school with full implementation of Tier I supports and Tier II beginning intervention supports. Our vision is to be a Leader in Me school with the underlying foundation of explicit student instruction of the 7 Habits of Happy Kids. Lake Arrowhead Elementary School's discipline practices and behavior management strategies comply with approved board policies and are designed to create effective learning environments and minimize classroom disruptions. Progressive discipline and proactive measures are employed in the classroom for those students experiencing difficulty following school rules and demonstrating positive behavior. Disciplinary intervention is managed by school administrators and the PBIS Team in a fair, firm, and consistent manner based upon the nature of each situation.

Decisions concerning selection of staff development activities are performed by all staff using tools such as teacher input and data analysis to determine the areas in which additional teacher training may enhance classroom instruction and increase student achievement levels. Lake Elementary School supports Arrowhead ongoing professional growth throughout the year on minimum days. Teachers meet in grade level teams to conduct data analysis to identify areas of need. Teaching staff are provided the opportunity to participate in district-sponsored staff development workshops or training sessions as 1) a supplement to site-based staff development, 2) for reinforcement of or follow-up on previous training, or 3) follow-up training for newly implemented programs/curricula.

Instructional Materials

All textbooks used in the core curriculum at Charles Hoffman Elementary School are aligned to the California Content Standards and Frameworks. Instructional materials are selected from the state's most recent list of standards-based materials and adopted by the State Board of Education; those materials that have not had new adoptions are utilizing supplemental materials to meet state standards. The district follows the State Board of Education's eight-year adoption cycle for core content materials (English/language arts, math, science, and social science).

On Thursday, September 09, 2021, the Rim of the World Unified School District's Board of Trustees held a public hearing to certify the extent to which textbooks and instructional materials have been provided to students. The Board of Trustees adopted Resolution No. 21/22-02 which certifies as required by Education Code §60119 (1) that textbooks and instructional materials were provided to all students, including English learners, in the district to the extent that each pupil has a textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home, and (2) sufficient textbooks and instructional materials were provided to each student, including English learners, that are aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks in math, science, history-social science, and English/language arts.

In addition to core subject areas, districts are required to disclose in their SARCs the sufficiency of instructional materials used for their visual/performing arts curricula. During the 2021-22 school year, Rim of the World Unified School District provided each student, including English learners, enrolled in a visual/performing arts class with a textbook or instructional materials to use in class and to take home. These materials complied with the state's content standards and curriculum frameworks.

Full-time equivalent (FTE) is a standard measurement used to identify an employee's regular work load on a weekly basis. For example, an FTE of 1.0 designates a full-time position and the employee is on campus and available all day every day of the week; an FTE of 0.5 indicates that the staff member is available and on campus a portion (50%) of the week.
