<u>Course Outline & Description</u>: Undoubtedly, this is uncharted territory for all of us and please know that we as a 10th grade history team went to great lengths to ensure that ALL students would get an equitable education regardless of technological access at home during this unprecedented time! In this distance learning section of the year, students will follow the curriculum as outlined in the syllabus from the beginning of the year starting with a unit on World War II and finishing the year with a second unit on The Cold War.

WWII UNIT: In the Unit on World War II, students will learn about the instability created in Europe by the First World War (1914-18) and how it set the stage for another international conflict–World War II–which broke out two decades later and would prove even more devastating. The investigation in this unit focuses on the following Essential Question: "Why did the Allied Powers win WWII?"

COLD WAR UNIT: In the unit on the Cold War, students will learn about the events that unfolded following WWII that brought a period termed by historian John Gaddis as the "Long Peace." This "Long Peace" refers to the period in which the years between the conclusion of the Second World War and the contemporary society in which we live today that is characterized by the idea that the major (1st World) powers have not been at war with one another. Despite this idea of peace in modern world history, nations have faced several issues that some would argue can be just as disastrous as total war: Genocide, Crimes Against Humanity, Poverty, Environmental Change, Nuclear Warfare, and the emergence of a Globalized society.

The investigation in this unit focuses on the following Essential Question: "Why did the Cold War develop into a direct military conflict between the United States and the Soviet Union?"
