The literature is taught as a whole work, not in edited or summary form. At times high quality literature includes themes and/or language that some parents find objectionable.

This notice is intended to inform you that some of the books on the reading list for your child's class may have been challenged by one or more parents or community members in the past. As required in Board policy, when a book is challenged, a committee reviews the novel and makes a recommendation to the Board of Education. When looking at your child's reading list, any book with an asterisk, (\*), by the title has been challenged, and the Board of Education has determined the book will remain on the reading list. As a parent, you may review any book on the reading list to determine if you would like your child
