




Introduction

The Oregon Battle of the Books is a statewide reading motivation and comprehension program sponsored by the Oregon Association of School Libraries in conjunction with a Library Services and Technology Act grant.

Students are exposed to fabulous literature representing a variety of literary styles and viewpoints.

The goals of the program are •to encourage and recognize students who enjoy reading •to broaden reading interests •to increase reading comprehension •to promote academic excellence.



The WOMS competition

These will be all class competitions. Mrs. F-B will ask random questions based on any of the novels from the list.

Answers will consist of book titles (3 points) and authors (2 points).

You will get three tickets per person to give titles. You may answer unlimited authors. So, *everyone should learn all the authors*, even if you don't read all the books because you can help your team that way. There is no "helping" among team members by calling out answers.

If your team misses a title, the question moves to the next team.



The state OBOB competition

These will be 4 person team competitions (with a 5th alternate member) with only one spokesperson per team.

These competitions will run differently. There will be "In which Book" questions - answers will consist of book titles (3 points) and authors (2 points)

And there will be and "Open Response/Content" questions - answers for these will be worth 5 points.

If your team misses a title, the question moves to the next team.

We will have local competitions at our school to determine the team which goes to regionals. The regional competition will have over 30 schools participating and will be held here at WOMS on Saturday, February 28th. Regional winners will go to the state competition in April.

Parvana dresses up as a boy so that she is able to work to earn some money for her family.

The Wednesday Wars by Gary Schmidt

Holling Hoodhood knows all about teachers. They're "born behind their desks, fully grown, with a red pen in their hand and ready to grade." And the worst of them hate your guts, which is precisely the way he believes Mrs. Baker feels about him. Every Wednesday afternoon, when the rest of his class leaves early to attend Hebrew school or catechism class, Holling, the lone Presbyterian, stays behind with Mrs. Baker. As Holling sees it, she uses the extra time for special torture.

The Wild Girls by Pat Murphy In 1972, Joan and her family move to California and quickly befriends an eccentric and independent girl, Sarah. The two girls dub themselves the "Wild Girls" -- brave and fearless conquerors of nature. But they are anything but fearless, and struggle with families that are disintegrating around them and afraid of what this means for them.

They do, however, share a love of writing and through a summer course in creative writing, they learn a lot more about themselves as well as how to craft a story.

Life in the gang, The Cobras, may be difficult, but at least with them Jordan feels like he has a family--something he hasn't felt since his father left. Then...something amazing happens--Jordan is transported back in time and begins living a parallel life as a slave on a 19thcentury plantation.
