


Schedule cards will be distributed during your counseling meeting on Thursday, January 27th during 6th hour.


Along with the schedule card, you will have the course offerings and instructions for filling out the schedule card.

#### **English**

#### 4 credits Required

Box A

Juniors are required to take a full year of ELA

- Students will choose either Applications & a Literature **OR** AP English
- Apps/Lit: Choose one semester of Apps of Comp AND one semester of a literature elective.
- AP English: Students who are strong in English may opt to take AP
   English Language and Comp for the full year. Please note strength and interest in ELA when choosing AP. Summer work will be required.
- Please consult with your semester 1 ELA teacher for appropriate placement.

#### Literature Classes

#### Lit of the Strange & Mysterious

- mystery, science fiction, fantasy, suspense, and horror.
- Novels include:
- Dracula, Hobbit, Cat's Cradle, The Adventures of Sherlock Holmes

#### **20th Century**

- Explore the intersection of history and literature
- Novels include:
- The Stranger, One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest, The Great Gatsby

#### **Exploring Lit**

- Read high interest books
- Novels include:
- Monster, All Quiet on the Western Front

#### Literature Classes

#### Mythology

- Learn about different world cultures and explore past civilizations
- Novels include:
- Thor, Homer & the Illiad, Beowulf, King Arthur

#### **Shakespeare**

- You will learn to read, understand, and LOVE Shakespeare
- Stories include:
- Macbeth, A Midsummer Nights, Dream, The Taming of the Shrew

#### **Poetry**

- Read shorter pieces, no novels
- Opportunity to write original poems

#### Literature Classes

#### Intro to Film and Screenwriting

- Watch and interpret Films instead of novels
- Write your own screenplay
- Films include
- Jaws, Psycho, The Artist

#### **True Stories**

- Literary non-fiction course
- Students will read autobiographies
- Novels include:
- Eat Pray Love, The Things they Carried

#### Science

**3 credits Required** 

#### Box B

Students are required to earn a 3rd science credit

- Students can choose Chemistry/Funds of Chemistry, Physics/Funds of Physics, or by taking one semester of Earth and Space Science paired with an additional one semester science elective.
- Difference between Fundamentals and other course
  - O STEM = Physics
  - O Life Science = Chemistry
- FLEX Option available for 3rd year requirement

#### Math

#### **4 credits Required**

- Check the next course in your math sequence.
- If you are currently in an Honors class and doing well, consider Honors again.
- If you are currently in an Honors class and doing "poorly", consider a "regular" math class for next year.

#### Box C

- If you are currently in a regular class and getting an "A" on your assessments, speak to your current (or 1st semester) math teacher about moving into the Honors track.
- Regardless of your situation, a discussion with your current (or 1st semester) math teacher is highly recommended.

Box D

Students are required to earn credit in both Gov and Econ

- Students can choose Gov or AP Gov and Econ or AP Econ
  - O AP Government is a full year course. Please consult with your semester 1 US History teacher if you are considering AP Gov
  - O Economics can be taken in junior or senior year
    - Both Econ and AP Microeconomics are semester long courses

- Keep college and career plans in mind when choosing classes.



#### **New Electives**

HISTORY OF ETHNIC AND GENDER STUDIES - # 20 WEEKS GRADES: 11-12 This course will examine Ethnic and Gender Studies in the United States from the beginning of settlement through the 21st Century. With a focus on the representation of ethnic groups and gender identity in society, history, social media, film, and in text, students will work to identify misconceptions, microaggressions, and both implicit & explicit biases. Students will engage in historical and contemporary (current) perspectives through a variety of active learning strategies and selected reading, culminating in individual research projects.

**Educational Careers** is a one-year course designed for students interested in pursuing a career in an educational field and/or getting an inside glimpse at the world of teaching. Students will examine and research the topics of educational history, schooling options, and the certification process. Students will also study and practice teaching methodologies and strategies, lesson planning, equity in the classroom and classroom management. Under the supervision of a cooperating teacher, students will participate in classroom observations and assist in Rochester classrooms, including in special education, elementary, or possibly middle school placements. Students will need to provide their own transportation to their placement school(s).

#### World Language

2 credits Required

Elective Option

- 2 years of the same language required
- FLEX option for 2nd year
  - O Consider college plans before choosing to FLEX

#### Physical Education

1 credit is Required

### Elective Option

**Option 1**: PE Activity Course and Health (9th – 12th grade)

**Option 2**: Flex – Participation in 2 seasons of a RCS approved MHSAA Sport or Marching Band is equivalent to .5 PE.

- Flex form must be turned in after the seasons are complete.
- Health is required with this option

<sup>\*</sup> Lifeguard Training: Earn your Red Cross card for a PE credit.

# Visual, Performing, & Applied Arts (VPAA)

1 credit Required

Elective Option

- See page 4 of the Registration Information booklet for a list of courses that fulfill the VPAA requirements.
- Can be used as a FLEX option for 2nd year of World Language

### Advanced Placement

### Elective Option

#### **Consult Subject Teacher**

- AP is short for "Advanced Placement" and is a collegiate level course taught at high schools nationwide.
- Rochester Schools offers 24 Advanced Placement courses. When considering taking an AP course, students must be sure they meet the prerequisite for the course as outlined in the Course Description Book. They should also consult with teachers and counselors.
- Every student who takes an AP course has the opportunity to take the AP exam on the scheduled exam day in May for the potential to earn college credit.
- Other benefits include exposure to rigorous content and early preparation for college. AP classes are demanding and require students to have a certain level of dedication and self-discipline in order to be successful in the class. This skill set can be extremely advantageous as high school students apply to college.

### Marching & Jazz Band

Box F

- Select Marching or/and Jazz Band. You cannot input this into Synergy online scheduling. Your counselor will input this for you.
- 2 seasons of Marching Band can be used as a FLEX option for PE (Must still take Health)



#### Box H

Juniors choosing Apps of Comp and a Lit will need to select 2 Lit alternates AP English students do not need to enter Lit alternates

- Choose two English Literature alternate classes and number them with a 1 or 2 for preference
  - O You will *not* enter these in StudentVue, rather your counselor will enter for you.

#### Alternate Electives

#### Box J

- Alternates are required
- You must fill out all 4 lines.
- Only enter courses you are willing to take.
- It's a good idea to choose classes that match subject areas from electives box.
- Pre-requisite and teacher approval also applies to alternate choices.
- Schedules will not be processed without alternates.


Please make sure your semesters on the front of the card add up to 12!


