Textbook Information	Tradition of Excellence, Book 2
Course Description	This course is designed for students that already know how to play an instrument. An audition is required. Instruments must be provided by each student. Students in this band continue to develop and refine basic individual and ensemble skills as well as begin to learn more advanced concepts and skills. Students in Concert Band are eligible for the (optional) spring band trip. Mandatory graded performances include (but are not limited to) three evening concerts per year, all Pep Band performances, and MPA (Music Performance Assessment) for a major portion of their grade.
Course Objectives	Students in Concert Band will continue to develop a good characteristic tone on their instruments. They will demonstrate rhythmic accuracy up to sixteenth notes and rests in simple meters. Students will develop appropriate instrument fundamentals including tone production, articulation, phrasing, dynamics, balance, and blend. Students will exhibit proper musical and mechanical fundamentals on their instruments. Students will also exhibit appropriate etiquette during rehearsals and performances.

Classroom Expectations	 When the bell rings, enter the band room, get your instrument from the storage room, and sit in your assigned chair. Do not play your instrument until instructed. Students will be considered tardy when not seated at the downbeat of the warm-up. Students must have all required equipment for every rehearsal: instrument, book, pencil, instrument accessories (ie. reeds, mouthpiece, neck strap, sticks/mallets, etc). Respect your directors, your classmates, and yourself. Listen and follow directions. Do not talk or be disruptive during rehearsals unless given permission. Do not touch other student's instruments or equipment. Do not play other student's instruments. Do not trade instruments. There is no food or drink (except water) allowed in the band room. Gum is never allowed in the band room. Only band students are allowed to enter the band room. The teacher dismisses the class, not the bell.

Late Work Policy	A student may make up missed assignments; however, they will lose points for work turned in late: Work that is less than 1 week past due (minus 10 points) Work that is between 1 & 2 weeks past due (minus 20 points) Work that is more than 2 weeks past due (minus 30 points) Work may NOT be submitted after the grading period ends
Make-up Work/Test Policy	Students with excused absences will be allowed to make-up all work within 1 week of returning to school without being penalized. It is the student's responsibility to ask for make-up work. Students can consult with a classmate or teacher for help. Work that is not made up will become a zero (including quizzes/tests). Please see the <i>LMS Band Handbook</i> for policies pertaining to missed playing assignments or missed performances due to excused absences. Students will not be allowed to make up work for unexcused absences as per Madison City Schools policy. Work missed in these instances will result in a zero.
Materials & Supplies	Tradition of Excellence, Book 2 (specific to each instrument) Flip Folder and Lyre (specific to each instrument) Required instrument accessories (i.e. reeds, neck straps, valve oil, slide grease, etc.) Appropriate instrument cleaning supplies (varies by instrument) Pencils Folding stand (recommended)
Homework	Students are expected to practice 15-20 minutes each day. During weeks without a mandatory performance, students may be assigned a recorded (video) playing excerpt to be submitted on Schoology.
Band Booster Organization	The LMS Band Boosters is a parent organization which supports the band by providing fund raising, chaperoning, and logistical assistance. The Boosters meet once each 9-weeks in the LMS Band room. Parents of students in all ensembles are encouraged to attend. The first meeting of the LMS Band Boosters will take place on Aug. 29 at 7:00pm. All other meeting dates can be found in the LMS Band yearly calendar of events.
