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The Donohue Family SkillPointe Scholarship



AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM/BROADBAND DISCOUNT PROGRAM

As of 12/13/21, eligible households are encouraged to apply to receive up to \$30 per month discount toward internet service up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands.

Households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, tablet from participating providers if they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program if a member of the household meets at least of the criteria below:

- Has an income that is at or below 200% of the federal poverty guidelines;
- Participates in certain assistance programs, such as SNAP, Medicaid, Federal Public Housing Assistance, SSI, WIC, or Lifeline;
- Participates in Tribal specific programs, such as Bureau of Indian Affairs General Assistance, Tribal TANF, or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations;
- Is approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program or the school breakfast program, including through the USDA Community Eligibility Provision in the 2019-2020, 2020-2021, or 2021-2022 school year;
- Received a Federal Pell Grant during the award year; or
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low-income program.

Each order includes four tests, which recipients can use to test themselves or their children. If you are interested in receiving multiple kits, you will need to reorder tests. Tests do not automatically ship on a recurring basis. Households can place two orders per week

COVID-19 Testing Q&A


- Q: Will Southwest Health System (SHS) provide testing for *asymptomatic* individuals? (i.e., travelers, preoperative clearance, etc.)
- A: SHS will still provide travel testing; however, a physician's order is required to be covered by insurance. If there is no physician's order or insurance, they will have to pay the cash price. For Pre-Op testing, an order from their provider or surgery center will be processed the same as always.
- Q: Where can a symptomatic individual get a test?

A: For a Rapid (antigen test):

- Over-the-counter (OTC) tests at Walmart, Safeway, City Market, gas stations, etc.
- Walgreens free appointment-based testing: <u>www.walgreens.com/findcare/covid19/testing</u>
- Free test kits directly mailed to you: www.covidtests.gov

For a PCR test:

- The Southwest Medical Group Walk-in Clinic is open Monday through Friday 8 am to 7 pm, Saturday and Sunday 9 am to 5 pm.
- Walgreens has appointment-based testing that is free.
- With a provider's order, testing is available at the Park Street Draw Station.
