WHAT IS FRIDAY ACADEMY?

Friday Academy is open to any high school student (grades 9-12) and is designed to help students gain a college certificate or industry certification during their school district's academic year. This Friday Academy exposes students to Career and Technical Education (CTE) and Guaranteed Transfer (GT) Pathways. Coursework includes assignments, projects, independent work and collaboration as expected in a typical college class.

In Friday Academy, students will have the opportunity to earn a college credential. These credits are transfer-ready, and the student can transition to a four-year institution in the state or matriculate to a two year community college to complete the associate degree in their chosen field. Students can earn as many as 30 college credits prior to graduation. Research studies on early college participation have shown that students perform well in their courses, graduate from high school at a higher rate than their peers, require less first-semester remediation in college, and are more likely to obtain a college degree within four years (Community College Research Center, Columbia University).

For those students interested in becoming workforce-ready, the student may earn an industry-approved, job-ready credential that prepares them to start work in their field of choice. This industry credential will increase employability upon graduation.

ORIENTATION AND FIRST DAY OF CLASS

The New Student Orientations will be conducted on the first Friday before the semester begins. Students will learn about PCC, will learn what it means to attend college, and will learn what the college's expectations are for conduct.

Students will be directed to and assemble for orientation in the Go!Zone on the Mancos campus. The Commons area is located in the main administration building. Students will be met there by Friday Academy ambassadors who will help guide them to their respective pathways' classroom.

COVID-19 Testing Q&A

- Q: Will Southwest Health System (SHS) provide testing for asymptomatic individuals? (i.e., travelers, preoperative clearance, etc.)
- A: SHS will still provide travel testing; however, a physician's order is required to be covered by insurance. If there is no physician's order or insurance, they will have to pay the cash price. For Pre-Op testing, an order from their provider or surgery center will be processed the same as always.
- Q: Where can a symptomatic individual get a test?

A: For a Rapid (antigen test):

- Over-the-counter (OTC) tests at Walmart, Safeway, City Market, gas stations, etc.
- Walgreens free appointment-based testing: www.walgreens.com/findcare/covid19/testing
- Free test kits directly mailed to you: www.covidtests.gov

For a PCR test:

- The Southwest Medical Group Walk-in Clinic is open Monday through Friday 8 am to 7 pm, Saturday and Sunday 9 am to 5 pm.
- Walgreens has appointment-based testing that is free.
- With a provider's order, testing is available at the Park Street Draw Station.
